

CENTREVILLE.

Dr. Liggett, a native of Scotland, was educated at the literary and medical departments of the University of Glasgow. He immigrated to the United States about 1842, and located at Centreville and practiced his profession there till 1846. His health commenced to fail and he thought a sea voyage might be beneficial, but his trip across the Atlantic did not improve his condition, and when he reached his native place he was too weak to return, and died in a few months.

Dr. Joseph McBeth, a native of Cherry Hill township, was educated at the Indiana academy; studied medicine with Dr. Stewart; attended a course of lectures at Jefferson Medical College, Philadelphia; located at Centreville in 1848, and practiced there about a year, and then moved to Ohio. He is now at Galena, O.

Dr. James Taylor, a native of Wheatfield township, was educated at Blairsville Academy; studied medicine with Dr. Emerson; graduated at the Jefferson Medical College, Philadelphia, settled at Centreville in 1849 and practiced there a few years and then moved to Fairfield, Westmoreland county, Pa., where he now resides. He represented Westmoreland county in the Pennsylvania Legislature in 1863 and 1864.

Dr. William Caldwell, a native of Indiana borough, where he was educated; learned the printing business and followed it for several years. He was one of the editors of the *Appalachian*, a paper published at Blairsville for a number of years, the firm being Mathias & Caldwell. He retired from the editorial business and studied medicine with Dr. Johnston, in Punxsutawney; attended a course of lectures, and located at Centreville in 1853, and practiced medicine about a year. He then moved to Blairsville and went into the drug and apothecary business; remained there for a few years and moved to Johnstown, where he is at present engaged in the mercantile business.
