Members may submit article of interest. Please cite sources. Queries, reunion notices and book reviews will be also be accepted.



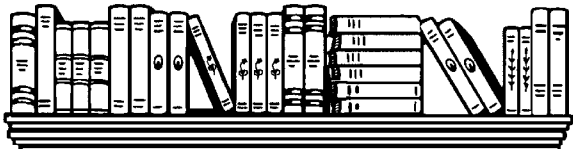

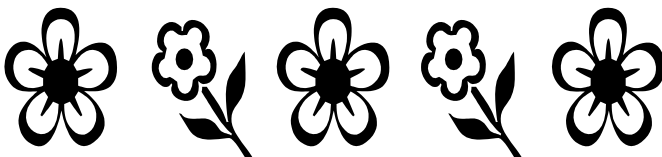
