Any Rosie may submit a story about her WWII experiences for publication; Rosebuds and Rivets may submit stories about their Rosie. All authors must be ARRA members. Only one story about each Rosie. If you have a story published in a previous book, this must be about a different event.

Stories must be typed, double spaced. Send one or two pictures, preferably one "then" and one "now." Word limit with one picture is 450 words; with two pictures, 350 words. Total words should be near the limit, in order to avoid too much blank space on page.

Be sure to include a signed statement: "I give permission for this story to be published by ARRA."

You must follow these instructions:

Story--proper length

Pictures: one or two

Permission statement must be signed

Otherwise your space may be given to someone else and your story not published.

. Do not send any money. You will be notified about your author's discount when it is published. And please wait patiently; publication takes time!
