Family History Tips



E-mail Saving Tip - I pretend to forward an e-mail. This puts the original header into the text of the e-mail. I can then select the text (CTR+A) and copy it (CTR+C). It can then be pasted directly into a word processor document. The e-mail can then be abandoned. I also use a very handy freeware program for these and other snippets of information that allows me to keep them all in one "database" and sort them into folders. Check for Similar Initials - For twenty years I came up against a brick wall every time I looked for my great-great grandfather, John Linzy Vaughan. I tried and tried. I looked at the online record and noticed that John S. was really John L. The father listed was T. E. (actually was J. E.) and his wife Vina along with another son William. We had always thought James Edward's wife was named Melvina. It turns out her name was Levina and I found her back farther. I still haven't had much luck finding James Edward and his ancestors but it did open a few doors for me. Encourage everyone to search for initials. Questions/Answers



QUESTION: My friend told me I could just remove my flash drive, but sometimes when I do, one or more files are missing. Do I always have to select the "unplug" icon before removing my flashdrive or not?

ANSWER: Most of the more recent versions of Windows have a default setting for flash drives that is called "Optimize for quick removal." You can easily verify this setting, and if it is not set, change your system to use it. Insert a flash drive into a USB port, then select My Computer. Right click the drive for your flash drive and select Properties. Select the Hardware tab, click on the flash drive, then select the Properties button. Click the Policies tab and make sure that the option for Optimize for quick removal is selected. You will then be able to remove it without "unplugging" it first.
