Readers, here are a few from her list to get you started. I will let you know when the list is available on my website for you to get the rest.

1. <http://www.lib.utah.edu/digital/unews/> - This is a great free web site to search old newspapers - Deseret News 1850-1898, Salt Lake Tribune the complete 1800's plus dozens of early small town newspapers in Utah.
2. <http://www.Rootsweb.com> - contains (free) extensive interactive guides and research tools. The site's WorldConnect Project contains more than 209 million names. It has huge mailing lists and genealogy links.
3. <http://www.Dearmyrtle.com> - (free) fun, helpful family history web site with a daily email newsletter, beginning online lessons, weekly chats, family history for kids and writing your personal history.

Questions/Answers



QUESTION: Using the Pedigree Resource File CD's, how do I go from the Master Index into the Pedigrees without exiting the program?

ANSWER: In Pedigree Resource File:

1. Click the number next to the name you would like to view in Pedigree.
2. A Details screen will appear. Click on the purple Pedigree icon in the upper-right corner.
3. You will see instructions that tell you which CD to insert.
4. After viewing the record, if you want to go back to the Master Index, click the Master Index button on the upper toolbar.

QUESTION: How do I restore a backup file made in Personal Ancestral File 3 to version 5?

ANSWER: You can restore a PAF 3 backup directly to PAF 5 as follows:

1. On the menu bar, click File, and click Restore.
2. In the Files of type: field, select the type of backup file you wish to restore. For a backup from Personal Ancestral File 3 or Personal Ancestral File 4, choose PAF 3/4 Backup Files from the list.
3. Highlight the file you want to restore, and click Restore.
4. After restoring the file, the computer will ask if you want to convert the file to Personal Ancestral File 5. Click Continue.
5. On the Create New File... screen, type a new name for the file in the File Name: field.
6. Click Save.
