Family History Tips



Leave a Genealogical Calling Card -- Make it easier for genealogical help to find you by creating business cards especially for genealogy. Include your name, contact information and surnames and places you're researching. Keep some in your research tote bag, and leave a card whenever you go to a cemetery (put it in a baggie under a rock by your ancestor's headstone), research facility or workshop. -- FamilyTree Newsletter, 8/16/07

WorldVitalRecords.com makes it very easy for users to create permanent links to their data. This makes sharing your valuable research with your family and friends very easy to do. Sharing links to a specific newspaper page is a popular and now easy process. First, find the page that you would like to share by searching or browsing. Second, simply click on the 'share' button above the page. An email will be created in your default email program that contains the link and a description. All you need to do is enter the person's email address to whom you would like to send the link.

The way to create a link to a specific data record is almost as easy. After you have located the person's record that you would like to share or link to, simply click on the icon to the left of the URL address and while holding down the mouse button, drag it to your word processing document. The URL starts out "http://www.WorldVitalRecords.com/..." and is in the address box of your internet browser. You can also drag that icon to your Internet browser's link bar for future use

as well.

I encourage you to create links to the people that you are researching. Add these links to your web pages, BLOGs, emails, and other information that you share with family and friends. This will make research easier for them and you can show off the work that you have done. ---David Lifferth, President, World Vital Records, Inc.

Questions/Answers



Question: If an ancestor was born or died in Colonial America (before the forming of the United States of America), what do I list as the country?

Question: When I copy a PAF file from my computer to a CD then copy it to another computer, PAF does not allow me to edit the file. Can you help?

Answer: When a file is copied to CD the properties are set to "read only". After you copy it to another computer, go to Windows Explorer (right-click start and select Explore). Locate the file, then right-click on the file and select properties. On the General tab, at the bottom, deselect "read-only" by clicking on the checked box. You can then open the file in PAF and edit it.

Google has made the full text of all US patents available to search at <http://www.google.com/patents>. This makes finding a patent by an ancestors' name far easier.

The **LDS Family History Library** at www.familysearch.org is the beginning point for most genealogists, and the **LDS Historical Department** at www.lds.org/churchhistory/archives is a great fount of historical information for LDS church members.

- Christen **Jensen** -b. 28 Oct 1848, Farre, Sporup, Skanderborg, Denmark; d. 31 Oct 1932, Manassa, Colorado.
- Helena Sofie **Rundqvist** -b. 24 Apr 1856, Nørre Sandby, Kristinastad, Sweden; d. 26 Sep 1902, Eastdale, Colorado.
