

SOME RESOURCES TO HELP YOU IN YOUR CALLING

Log on to the <https://new.familysearch.org> website and sign in. On your nFS homepage, click on the “Help Center” link.

Click on the “Training and Resources” tab near the top of the page. This will take you to a page which contains a number of helpful resources. Browse through them and find the ones that will be most helpful to you.

In the section headed “Training and Other Helpful Resources” look at the section titled “E-learning Courses”. This contains much information for the family history consultant as well as for priesthood leaders.

Be aware that some of these training resources are only available after you have registered as a consultant or a priesthood leader at: <http://consultant.familysearch.org>

Ohana Software <http://www.ohanasoftware.com> has a number of helpful resources at their website. Under the “Community” link at the top of the page you will find a number of other links that take you to ideas and training resources. The “FHC ideas” link has many resources for different organizations in the Church. (Primary, YMYW, RS, Priesthood, etc.)

Also at the Ohana site under the “Support” tab you will find many lessons and answers to frequently asked questions (FAQ). Take the time to visit this site and acquaint yourself with the numerous resources that are available.

And, if you want a very COMPLETE list of resources, go to the NFS Help Center (link on your nFS homepage) and on the “Find Answers” tab, search for the term “wiki”. This will give you Document ID #106925 which has training sites recommended by the Church along with some attachments in pdf format that you can download.

Also, check out the classes available at the Family History Center. There, you will find many classes related to research skills, using different software programs, promoting family history in the ward and stake, using the internet to help with your family history, enhancing personal and family histories, and many other helpful topics.
