

#### RECOMMENDED BYLAWS CHANGE



The CCGS Board of Directors recommends the following change to the CCGS Bylaws: Article VIII, Library, Section 4 – Delete the first sentence of Section 4, which reads "The Board of Directors shall establish a fee for use by nonmembers." The rest of Section 4 gives the Board of directors the authority to establish and approve all rules governing library activities and holdings.

Removing the first sentence of Section 4 would give the board more flexibility and allow a change of policy to request donations from nonmembers and members alike. The board feels this change would not result in a loss of revenue, and might even increase it to some extent. This change in the CCGS Bylaws will be voted on by members present at the February general meeting. Please attend.


