

STATE RECORDS ON THE WEB Glen Jones

A question came up during our Land Records Class on Saturday, 21 February, about state records online. The March/April issue of Ancestry magazine has an article, "Wired States of America." It lists the various states that now have online archives and gives the URL's for those archives. This is a boon to researchers. Jane Germann went online during the class and was able to find land records of various states for several members of the class.

I am sure many of our members are familiar with the Washington State Digital Archives, which were among the first in the nation. Now most of the other states have put at least some of their historic records online.

As a note of Interest, the Washington Vital Records Department no longer allows the Washington State Digital Archives to post the birth and death certificates.

FOREIGN GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY MEMBERSHIP

Have you thought about joining a foreign genealogical society? There are some questions for which you need answers: What is the process? How do you pay for membership? Will you get quarterlies, or is that an extra charge because of distance and mail charges?

For example, I am thinking of joining a genealogical society in NW France. The membership form is on the Internet, but no way to send money is provided. Checking with the Bank of America, which does foreign exchange here, I find there are options.

- 1. Get a cashier's check, see the difference between euros and dollars, pay the \$25 fee for the transaction, and send the check with the membership form.
- 2. Go on line and get a special credit card from B of A for on-line shopping, with a special credit card number protected by bank security.
- 3. Go to the Post Office and get an International Money Order (I found out that I could not get one to send to France.)
