RESEARCH TECHNIQUES

Ten ways to locate your ancestor's birthplace by **Janice Nickerson** in *Family Chronicle* March/April 2003

- 1. Obituaries and Death Notices (usually published within 3 weeks of death)
- 2. Probate Records

(heirs here and in the old country/address)

3. Gravestones

(may list village of origin in old country)

- 4. Marriage Announcements (may list birthplace of bride/groom)
- 5. Local news items

(ship arrivals and land sales)

6. Community Histories

(may be written in only glowing terms)

- 7. Immigration/Naturalization (good source/may be difficult to find)
- 3. Passenger Lists

(prior residence and fellow passengers)

9. Assisted Immigration

(emigrants "assisted" in coming to USA)

10. Child Imigrant Schemes

(orphans or abandoned children)
