that PROVES a marriage took place. Also learn about the different types of records that are included in marriage records vs marriage applications.

#### **CENSUS**

As the decade opened in 1850, the U.S. Federal Census counted 23,191,876 residents in the U.S. Of this number 2,244,602 were enumerated as being of foreign birth (about 9.7%). Not surprisingly, due to the Irish Potato famine of the 1840s, 961,719 people claimed Irish origins (close to 43%) making it the largest single country of origin cited. These numbers did not go unnoticed in urban areas and resentment of the Irish Catholic immigrants paved the way for a period of nativism.

The anti-immigrnt sentiment was largely due to fears - fears that immigrant workers willing to accept lower pay would take their jobs; fears that the growing number of Roman Catholics would put loyalty to the pope over country; and fears that more Catholics would men more votes that could sway power politically.
