The Scottish Mayflower

Our guest speaker tonight, **Rich Shader** is no stranger to our group having presented a well-received program to our society on *Clans, Kilts & Tartans* at our September meeting in 2006. He is a member of the Scottish Tartans Authority, USA and is the Central Florida Commissioner of Clan MacLeod Society, USA.

He is recognized as a Central Florida authority on Scottish/Celtic culture. We are fortunate that he is willing to share his expertise with us.

SURNAMES HOW TO FORM PLURALS

Many people have the erroneous idea that plurals are formed by adding an apostrophe and the letter "s". This is not the case. Apostrophes are NOT used to form plurals, but to form possessives (as in *John Smith's family* and *Tom Watts' house*) and to indicate contraction or abbreviation (as in *can't*, *didn't* and *nat'l*).

Surnames are pluralized in the same manner as ordinary nouns, by adding "s" or "es".

In general, if the name ends in a letter other than "s", simply add an "s". Note: ordinary nouns ending in "y" change "y" to "i" and add "es", as in *babies*, but family names are not changed.

If the name already ends in an "s", "z", "sh" or "ch", then you simply add "es". Examples: Joneses, the Sanchezes, the Wattses, the Owenses, the Bushes.

If you want to make a plural name possessive, then add an apostrophe after the final "s", as in the *Smiths'* house, the *Donaldsons'* land, the *Wattses'* ancestors.

NEED PRE-1946 MILITARY PERSONNEL FILES?

The National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) will open for the first time all of the individual Official Military Personnel Files (OMPFs) of Army, Army Air Corps, Army Air Forces, Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard military personnel who served and were discharged, retired or died while in the service prior to 1946. Additional records will be made available to the public each year through 2067 until the entire collection is opened.

These archived files are treasured by family members, historians, researchers and genealogists. Contained in a typical OMPF are documents outlining all elements of military service including assignments, evaluations, awards and decorations, education and training, some medical information and documented disciplinary actions. Some records also contain photographs of the individual and official correspondence concerning military service.

Cost? Copy fees are waived for veterans or primary next-of-kin (surviving spouse or children of the veteran). The fee schedule for others:

OMPFs 5 pages or less: \$15

OMPFs 6 pages or more (most OMPFs fall in this category): \$50

OMPS of Persons of Exceptional Prominence (PEP): \$.75 per page. PEP records pertain to famous individuals such as former Presidents, famous military leaders, decorated military heroes, celebrities, entertainers and professional athletes who left military service and who have been deceased for at least 10 years.

NARA GIFT FUND DOLLARS FOR DOCUMENTS

Each year GSNB donates \$1 per member to this fund. Based on last year's membership, our recent donation amounted to \$72.

Established in 1983, this fund which is administered by the Federation of Genealogical Societies seeks to raise funds to create finding aids and to microfilm valuable research materials held by the National Archives in Washington, DC.

The current goal is to raise \$1.25 million to microfilm two collections - the War of 1812 Pension and Bounty-land Warrant Records and the Compiled Service Records of the United States Colored Troops. Once microfilmed these records will become accessible to researchers *via* the Family History Library and at the National Archives regional branches such as the Southeast Regional Archive located in Morrow, GA which serves AL, FL, GA, KY, MS, NC, SC and TN.

Be Part of Something Big!

The Family History Library is indexing its 2.5 million microfilms and 1.5 million microfiche to make 5 billion documents easily accessible to people all over the world, free of charge. The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints expects to have 100,000 volunteers by the end of the year, and hopes to eventually have one million volunteers. You do not have to be a member to participate in this project; join in if you have the Internet and occasional half hours! To extract information from digital images of historical documents go to:

www.familysearchindexing.org

- Establish that your computer has the needed <u>specifications</u>.
- Set up as a VOLUNTEER with a user name and password.
- INSTALL the needed program.
- Go to HELP for a tutorial on indexing guidelines.
- Select a PROJECT and learn specifics about the chosen records.
- START INDEXING: the handwritten records will appear on the screen, along with a form or table to be completed with your typewritten extraction. Type what you see!
- Once downloaded, you can index the documents off line.
- Each batch of downloaded records takes 30-40 minutes to index.
- Each handwritten record is indexed twice by two different volunteers; if there are any discrepancies an experienced genealogist will look at the original record and make a final decision on the name, date, or place. If you are experienced, ask to be an arbitrator.
