NOTICE OF MEETING

Program: **Archives of the Episcopal Diocese of Maryland.**

Our speaker, **Ms. Mary O. Klein, Archivist at The Episcopal Diocese of Maryland**, will introduce us to the location, operations, and collections of the Maryland Diocesan Archives. These archives hold the official records, manuscripts, and related materials from 1676, concerning the Church of England in colonial Maryland and its successor since the Revolution, the Episcopal Church in Maryland, to the present.



Ms. Klein has been the Archivist for the Diocese of Maryland since 2002. Her background is in history and archives work, having earned both her B.A and M.A. from Salisbury University. She has been active in Episcopal Church matters on the local, diocesan, and national levels.

The Maryland Diocesan Archives contains a vast collection of materials. The collections are strongest in the period 1730 to 1900. Materials covering the entire state and District of Columbia include official records, correspondence, minutes, and other records of the Diocese of Maryland and its bishops, clergy, churches, institutions, and organizations. These records are augmented by colonial manuscripts, many colonial and later sermons, parish histories, registers of closed churches, biographical writings, family papers, educational materials, and memorabilia. The archival and manuscript collections are supported by a small library of selected books, periodicals, newspapers, maps, and photographs.

You may be surprised to learn that your search for family records could be enhanced by a visit to the Archives of the Episcopal Diocese of Maryland. Ancestors' names may turn-up in surprising places such as eighteenth century parish tax roles, on parish deeds of donation signed by vestry members, or church records kept by clergy who forgot to leave them with the parish.

The Archives is located in the Diocesan Center on the Cathedral grounds, and is open Monday from 9 am until 2 pm., and Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 8:30-4.

Please, mark your calendars and join us for this informative presentation.

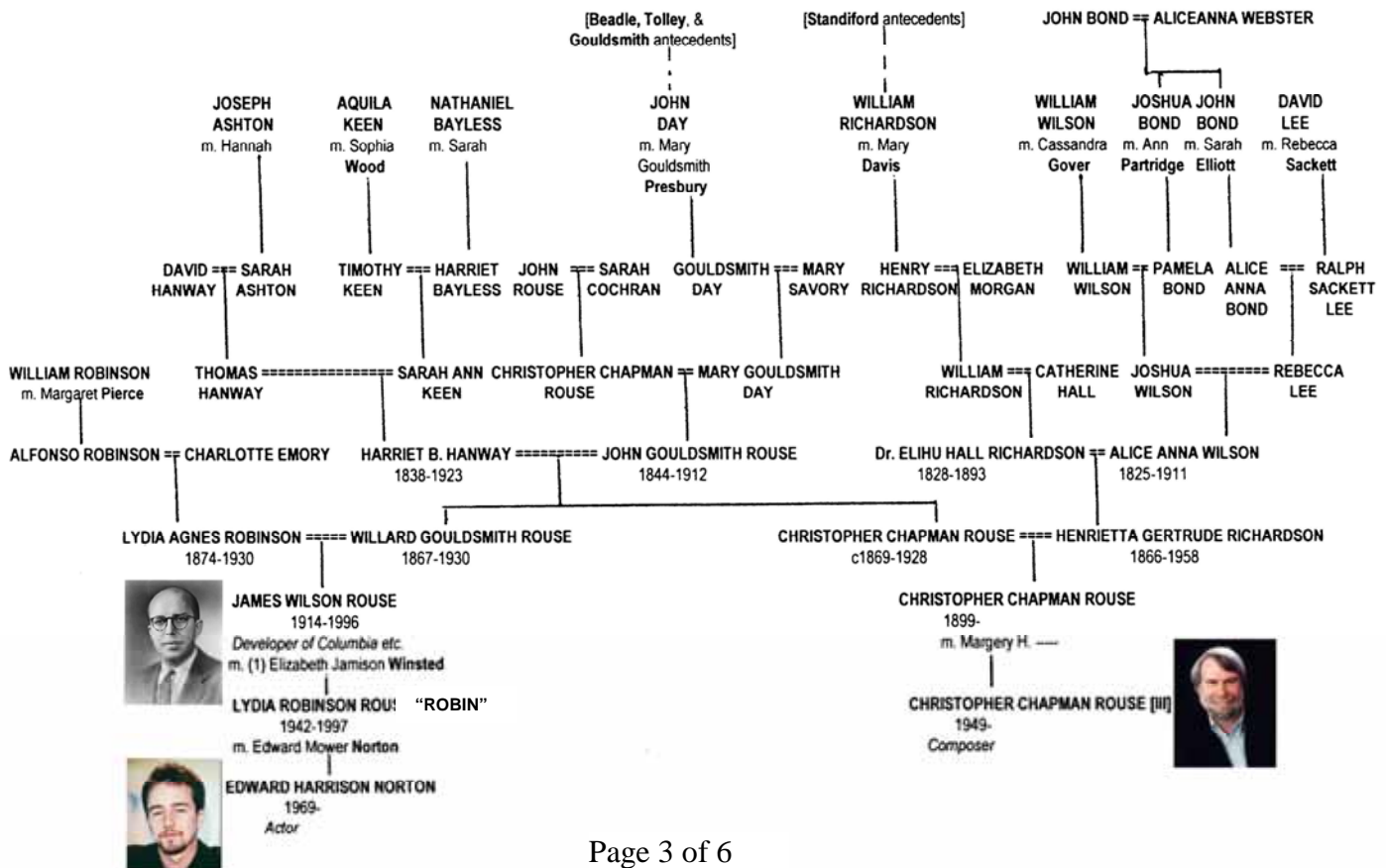

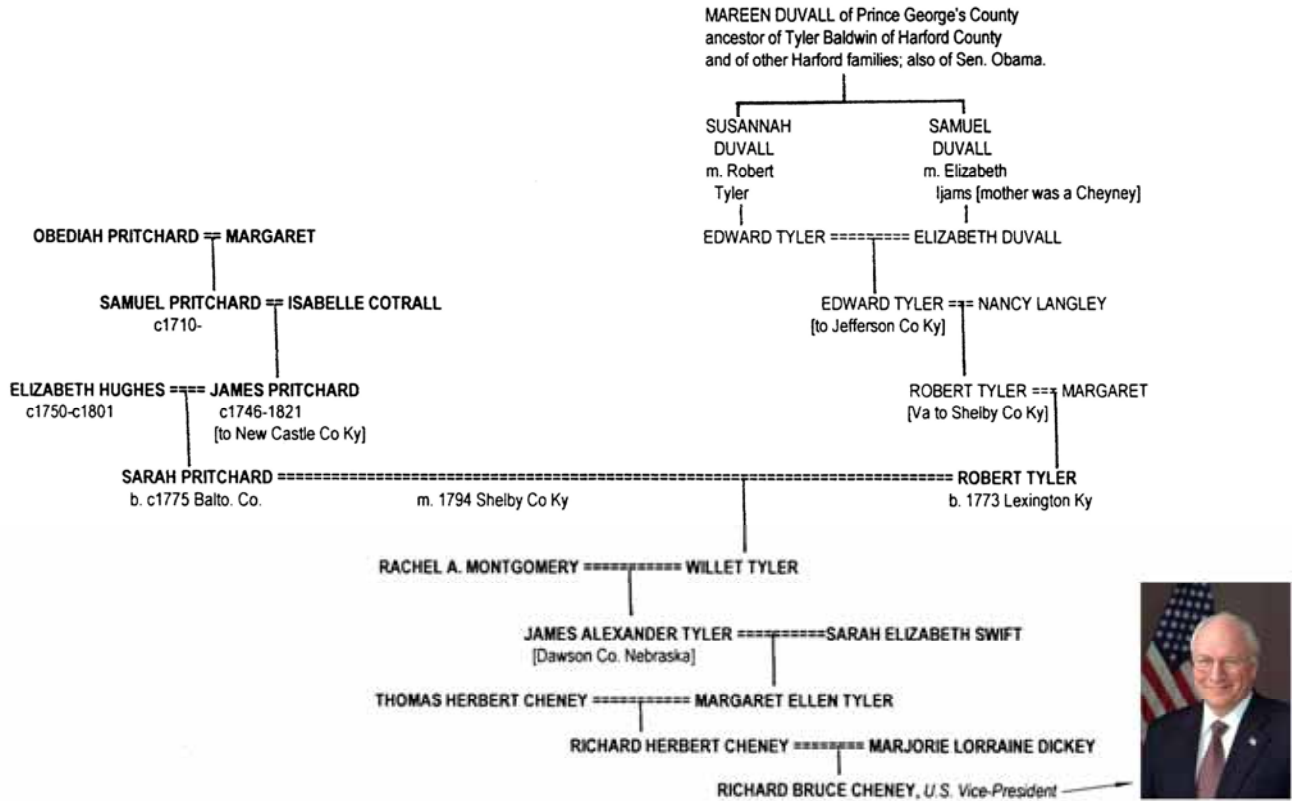
Pedigree Charts for Prominent Persons

Broad Creek Cemetery

Carson, John

I am helping my sister research the family of John Carson who apparently changed his name to Carsins (or Carsin--it is written several different ways). He was born February 18, 1795 and died October 20, 1838. He lived in Harford County, MD and was apprenticed at the age of 11 to a man named Dean to be a miller. His apprenticeship papers do not indicate that he had parents. He married Ann Coen, also of Harford Co. MD. At the time of his death he was the Sheriff of Harford Co. He resided in what became Carsins Run. I know a lot about his descendants, but have no clue about his ancestors. Any ideas would be appreciated. [Sandi Wallis]

Griffith, Tho.

I found the Will of Tho. Griffith with bequests to his wife Lucey Griffith of 1000 acres on the Susquehannah River (450 acres on the north side "Mount Arakat" and 550 acres on the south side of "Alveys"); Edward Helle his choice of 3 islands; Elizabeth Ward, sister; Mary Saward and 2 oldest sons; Henry Hazellwood. Date 20 April 1665. Witnesses: Lewis Stockett, Rich. Loes. Will proved on 25 June 1666 by Lewis Stockett. I'm interested in learning any information about... people mentioned in this Will and their relationships... [Ellen Ward]

Haunted House of Joppa

I'm trying to put together a "Cast Genealogy" from the old Haunted House of Joppa which ran from 1966 to 1981. Any leads or resources? Any links to the old Harford Democrat? [Ron Byrd] Ans: *many family members have responded.*

Woodside property

Trying to find the house built in the 1820s by my gr/gr/gr grandfather, Dr. Joshua Wilson. The house, named "Woodside," is near Emmorton and was occupied by family at least until the 1960s. It was the subject of a 1961 article in the Aegis. Several references to it are in the Historical Society card file, and the name "J.Wilson" appears near Emmorton on the historical wall map of the Society. Despite these leads, I was unable to learn the address or whether the house has been razed. My trips up and down the Emmorton and Old Emmorton Roads turned up nothing useful.
