#### IN MEMORIAM

#### Margaret Spencer Bishop 1933 - 2011

It is with deep sorrow that we mark the passing of Peggy Bishop, a long time member of our Society, Secretary for fifteen years, a Family History volunteer, member of The Historical Society of Harford County, MD Historical Society, MD Genealogical Society, and a good friend.

Peggy's activities focused on Family Histories, genealogy, cemetery records, birth and anniversary clippings, and church histories. Some of her published works included HCGS Special Publications dealing with Naturalizations, 1865 Voter Registrations, Funeral Homes, and Older Churches, plus a HSHC *Harford Historical Bulletin*, 42 (Fall 1989), article "Canning Industry in Harford County," and a history of William Watters Memorial Church. Recently, she was one of several volunteers, who are abstracting and indexing documents in HSHC Court Records section.


#### MIGRATION OF RELATED PEOPLE TO HARFORD: An Outstanding Example

In my ongoing research on local families, I have noted that it is quite common for one set of migrants to the area to soon be followed by related or neighboring groups from the same place of origin. Of course, the most obvious instance of this pattern is the wholesale migration from Southwestern Virginia and northwestern North Carolina from early in the 20<sup>th</sup> century and continuing to today. In the mid-19<sup>th</sup> Century, there were also many newcomers from the areas around Philadelphia, in both Pennsylvania and New Jersey, with familial connections among them. Some of my own kin fit that mold.

Below is a chart showing the relationships of descendants of a Quaker family named Palmer from Pennsylvania, who eventually migrated to Harford County - principally in the Aberdeen-Perryman and Havre de Grace areas. Most of the supporting data was published in Sarah Moore Fell (1822-1911): Genealogy of the Palmer Family in America, descended from John & Christian Palmer who settled in Bucks County, Pennsylvania 1683. (Wilmington, typescript, 1902). Among the more well-known Harford families descending from that couple are Palmer, Pennington, Lovett, Mitchell, Kelly, Allen, Carroll, Rickey, and Stockham. Names underlined are of migrants to Harford County. To reduce clutter, marriages are only shown where a daughter takes her husband's surname. Each horizontal level represents a generation, and lines point to offspring.

Keep this example in mind when one of your ancestors abruptly vanishes from local records. More often than not, they pulled-up roots and followed a relative to greener pastures, to rent or share a new place to live.



#### **GENEALOGY TIDBITS**

#### RESEARCH HOMEWORK

March 20, is expected to be a busy research day at the Harford County Historical Society for our members. Are you prepared? As a quick refresher, a list of collections, with brief descriptions has been included in this newsletter. If you see a collection that you have not searched, then gather your notes, and prepare for the hunt. Better yet, start searching at home using the HSHC PastPerfect-online database. Check-out the "HSHC PastPerfect-Online" article in the May 2010 HCGS Newsletter, pp. 3-5, available on our Society's website: <a href="http://www.rootsweb.ancestry.com/~mdhcgs/NEWSLETTER\_2010-05.pdf">http://www.rootsweb.ancestry.com/~mdhcgs/NEWSLETTER\_2010-05.pdf</a> You will not be searching everything available, because the online index is incomplete, and not every folder and carton has been opened, but it is a giant step forward. Do not forget to note on your Research Log, the revision dates of any index searched. Next year you will want to take another look, and it is a very painless process!

When you walk into the HSHC HQ you will want to immediately start asking Librarians for specific materials. Don't spend valuable time searching indexes that can be searched from home. If you have done your research homework, and created several Research Logs, you will be *off-to-the-races*. Your Logs should specify WHO (**surname, given name**), WHEN (**event and date**), and WHERE (Harford County **geographical location**), followed by the call numbers for the materials you want to examine. More about Research Logs can be found in the Jan 2011 HCGS Newsletter.

It can be helpful to use a word processor to create your Logs, because transferring your search terms and results can be done quickly if you block and COPY the webpage info, then simply PASTE it into your Research Log. Hyperlinks are also moved into your document so descriptions of the materials they reference can be accessed as if you were still on the webpage.

Seek the best tools for the task. Some of the HSHC information can be more conveniently and more robustly searched elsewhere. As an example, most on-line US Census data has recently been indexed and re-indexed using modern techniques, with vigorous crosschecking. Most sites, instantly provide an original hand-written page image for browsing and downloading to your library. The HSHC has a great new microfilm capability, but census data is better searched elsewhere, using Ancestry<sup>TM</sup> or HeritageQuestOnline<sup>TM</sup> (available at HCPL).

NEVER bring ORIGINAL documents, books, artifacts, etc. to the HSHC HQ, unless they are gifts to the collections. They took a lot of effort to obtain, and you do not want them damaged *-use a working copy*.
