I, James A. McClintock, of the County of Highland and State of Ohio, being of sound mind and memory, do make and constitute this my last will and testament, as follows, to wit:

First, I will and desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid by my executor hereinafter named;

Second, I will and bequeath to my daughters; Margaret Munnay wife of Seth J. Munnay; Mary C. Snuber wife of William Snuber; Samantha Miller wife of John D. Miller; and to my son, William B. McClintock, each Fifty Dollars (\$50.) to be paid by my ^{son James H. McClintock} ~~executor~~ as hereinafter stated;

Third, About fifteen years ago I loaned to ~~my~~ son, William B. McClintock Forty Dollars (\$40.), which I desire to be taken out of his legacy of Fifty Dollars aforesaid, and if the same, with interest, shall amount to more than said

legacy. I desire the same to be
receipted for, in full, by my
executor hereinafter named.

Fourth

Whereas I hold a promissory
note on Seth J. Munnay for
Twenty Five Dollars (\$25.) dated
A. D. 1848, which sum, with
the interest which is due there
on, I wish to be taken out
of the sum of Fifty Dollars
aforesaid, bequeathed to Margaret
Munnay, wife of said Seth
J. Munnay.

Fifth

I will and devise to my
son, James M. McClintock, to have
and to hold, to him and his
heirs forever: Lots nos 202,
181, 182, 191, 192, 201, 211, 212, 221, 231,
and out-lots nos 45, 55, 46, 49,
54, 64, and ⁽¹²⁰⁾ 120 pieces of the west
side of out-lot no. 50. Also —
out-lots nos 63, 53, 65, 73, and 83,
in the town of New Market in
the ~~County~~ County of Highland and
State of Ohio. Known and
designated on the recorded
plat of said town, by said

Numbers.

Sixth. I further will and desire that my son James D. McClintock be released from all claims or claims whatsoever that may or might be brought against him for or on account of deeds or other things transacted between me and himself; he having satisfied me in full for all claims whatsoever heretofore existing between us.

I also will and bequeath to my said son James D. McClintock. One Bed and bedding; and one Side Saddle;

Seventh. I will and bequeath to my Grand daughter Alice Gruber daughter of Mary C. Gruber aforesaid. One Bed and bedding. one Cow. and one Bureau.

Eighth. I will and devise to my son ~~James~~ James E. McClintock. to him and his heirs forever. Lot No 186. as known and designated on the recorded plat of the town of New Market in.

County and State aforesaid.

also a tract of Fifteen Acres
of Land. situate in said County
of Highland and State of Ohio
on the waters of the Rocky
Creek of Paint Creek, described
as follows to-wit:

Beginning at a stone in
the Road. South East corner
to George W. Barrere's wood
lot, running thence with
said Barrere's line N 10° E.
100. poles to a maple. South
west corner to Vance's lot
of Land, formerly Madman's lot:
thence with said Vance's line
S 80° E. 24 poles to a white oak
thence S 10° W. 100 poles to a
stone in the middle of the
Road: thence N 80° W. 24. poles
to the Beginning.

I hereby
constitute and appoint my
son James H. McClintock
executor of this my last
will and testament.
Hereby revoking all other

wills by me made, and consti-
tuting, ordaining and establish-
ing this my last will and
testament. As an addition
to the foregoing will and for
the purpose of making the
same plain, I hereby will
and bequeath to my son Cal-
vin E. McClutock all my
household goods, and scit-
er furniture, which I have
not heretofore in this will
disposed of. I further will
and direct that my executor
shall procure and put up
over the grave of my de-
ceased wife and my own
grave after my death, sub-
stantial, decent and respec-
table tombstones.
