Gallia County ss} Be it Remembered that heretofore to wit at a court of Common pleas continued and held at the courthouse in the town of Gallipolis County of Gallia and State of Ohio on tuesday the Eighteenth Wednesday the nineteenth day of April in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty and in the Eighteenth year of this state before the honorable Ezra Osborn Thomas Rodgers and Joseph Fletcher associate Judges of the court of Common pleas for and within the said County of Gallia the last will and testament of Philip Roush late of the County deceased was presented for probate David Knapp and George Roush Junior the sole executors therein named. Whereupon Jacob Roush and George Switzer two of the subscribing witnesses thereto came before the court and after being duly sworn declared they were present when the testator signed and acknowledged the same for his last will and testament that they believed he was of sound mind memory and Judgment and that they signed the same as witnesses in the presence of the testator and of each other Whereupon the same is proved approved and allowed as the last will and testament of the said Philip Roush and ordered to be recorded

And thereupon the said **David Knapp** and **George Roush Junior** with **Joseph Mauck** and **William Bing** their securities executed and acknowledged their bond in the penal sum of four thousand Dollars and being thereupon Duly sworn ordered that letters of testamentary issue accordingly

On application ordered that **Joseph Mauck William Bing** and **Samuel Bing** after being duly sworn do value and appraise in current money of the United States the goods and Chattels which were of Philip Roush late of this County Deceased and they are ordered to make return in the Clerk's office in three months according to law - And at the same time came also before the Court **Catharine Roush** the widow of the deceased who after being duly cautioned declared that she relinquishes her right of Dower and that she claims under the will

Hence Follows a copy of the last will and testament of the said Philip Roush late of Gallia County deceased and the same is Follows "to wit"

In the Name of God amen

I Philip Roush of the county of Gallia and State of Ohio being of perfect mind and memory do

make this my last will and testament in the manner and form as followeth "to wit" I do order that all my just debts be paid by my executors further I do order give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Catharine during the time she remains my widow one bed one Spinning wheel one cow one chest one Iron pot also two kettles one small and mittle size also one Capert [carpet?] one dresser and two sheep also one little pot and two pewter basons and one brass kettle also her choice of all the tea chane [china?] and other dishes that she want.

I do order give and bequeath unto my two youngest sons George and Jonas and their heirs and assigns forever a certain tract of land containing by [] one hundred and twelve acres, where the[y] now live both my sons George and Jonas - George is to have the upper tract and Jonas the lower tract further It is my will that my two sons George and Jonas is to have my wagon with the geers and Jack Screw they are to have equal shares. Further It is my will that my Sons George and Jonas one year after my death is to pay equal fifty pounds to my Eldest Child corent money of this state and so on every year all the part my Youngest Child further It is my will that my two sons George and Jonas is to have equal shares of the money of Shenandoah County what's left after my death

Further It is my will and I do order and give and bequeath all the remaining part of my personal estate which is not herein before willed to be equally divided amongst my children or their heirs

Further I do appoint my will to David Knapp and my son George Roush executors of this my last will and testament revoking & recalling all other wills and testaments this to be my last will and Testament.
