

Clarendon Chapter Places Historical Marker



The Clarendon Chapter placed a Colonial Dames XVII Century Historical Marker at the LaGuardo Cumberland Presbyterian Church in LaGuardo, Tennessee on November 7, 2009 honoring the church's long history in the community. The beginning of the church was 1861 when land was deeded to the church, with the present building constructed in 1901. No major structural changes occurred until 1979 when Sunday School rooms and a Fellowship Hall were added and the interior of the sanctuary completely remodeled.

Chapter President and State Historian Mrs. Ben Johnson Jr. introduced the program participants. Mrs. R. D. Pearson, Sr., Chapter First Vice President, was mistress of ceremonies. Mrs. J. Kenneth York, Honorary State President, brought greetings from the State Society. Chapter Secretary and Marker Chairman Mrs. Owen Scott Deathridge III presented the bronze marker, which was accepted by Alfred Adams, III, an active member of the church today, and a descendant of the man who originally donated the property for the church.
