

#### **Death of State Historian Charlene Johnson**

State Historian **Charlene Langley Johnson** passed away on November 15, 2010. Funeral services were held on November 19, 2010. The following was included in her obituary:

Charlene Johnson currently serves as President of both Crockett's Forge Seat Chapter of the US Daughters of 1812 and the Clarendon Chapter of Colonial Dames 17th Century. She also currently holds the office of Recording and Correspondence Secretary of the Middle Plantation Chapter of the Daughters of the American Colonies and has served in the past as Registrar and Regent of the Cumberland Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution in which she still holds membership. On the State level, she serves as Curator for the Daughters of 1812 and as Historian for the Colonial Dames 17th Century. Mrs. Johnson is a member of Centenary United Methodist Church in Nashville. Preceded in death by her father, Charley F. Langley; brothers, Jerry P. Langley and Dale J. Langley. Survived by husband, Ben Johnson; mother, Nida Mae (Bell) Langley of Murfreesboro; sister, Denise L. (Jim) Moran of Hermitage; brother, Charley L. (Jamie) Langley of Murfreesboro; sister-in-law, Linda F. Langley of Lawrenceburg; and nephews, Justin R. Langley, Alex C. Moran and Andrew J. Langley.

A new theme this year for the third bedroom was an original tree decorated with natural ornaments including hornet and bird nests.
