Located at 32975 Redmond Lane, ½ mile west of U. S. Highway 31, 2 miles south of the intersection with Highway 59 in Stapleton. The property is owned by Allen C. Cox and the cemetery is on his property which he bought in 1982. He should be contacted at 251-621-1194 for permission to view this cemetery. Mr. Cox's father, Wilton E. Cox is also buried here just outside the walled graves.

The cemetery is located within a rock wall with a beautiful wrought iron gate. The cemetery has been carefully restored and maintained by Mr. Redmond and is one of the best examples of cemetery care in Baldwin County. Behind the enclosed graves, planted with banana trees, Mr. Redmond found several graves marked only with rotted wooden markers, which are believed to be the graves of slaves of the Stapleton or Hall family. No further information is available at this time about those graves.
