The Northeast quarter of Section Sixteen (16), Township Six (6) South, of Range Three (3) East of St Stephen's Meridian, being one hundred and sixty acres (160) more or less according to the government survey.

Together with all the rights and appurtenances to said described premises in anywise belonging: To have and to hold the same forever.

And Cornelia D Slosson and Edwin Slosson, her husband, for them and their heirs, the said described premises and appurtenances, will forever Warrant and Defend unto the said party of the second part, their heirs and assigns, against the lawful claims of all persons whatsoever.
