ONTARIO RECORDS

Ontario government registration of births, marriages and deaths (civil registration) began July 1st 1869. However, government registration of marriages began much earlier.

HISTORIC RECORDS

As of August 2007, the Archives of Ontario holds the indexes and registration records of vital events for the following years:

Births: 1869-1910 Marriages: 1869-1925 Deaths: 1869-1935



All historic records of civil registration are publicly available on microfilm. Each year a new year's records are released to the Archives. The records are restricted until they have been made available on microfilm. The Archives of Ontario can be contacted in number of ways:

- 1. In the main Reading Room of the Archives at: 77 Grenville Street, Toronto, Ontario, Canada.
- 2. By Interloan from the Archives of Ontario to your public library (limit of 3 reels per researcher will be sent). More information is available from the Microfilm Interloan Services catalogue at: http://www.archives.gov.on.ca/english/interloan/index.html
- 3. On loan through local Family History Centres of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints (LDS). You must visit the local Centres as they do not accept written inquiries.

The Archives cannot conduct searches. Searches can be done by the public using the Vital Statistics microfilm in the Archives' Reading Room or on loan to the nearest public library or Family History Centre. Professional genealogical researchers can also be hired to do searches.
