March 12. Millikin, Robert.

"Over the Range"

It becomes our painful duty to record the death of one of our old timers. Mr. Robert Millikin passed "over the range" from Denver on Wednesday last, March 5, after a long and painful seige of inflammatory rheumatism, the immediate cause of his death being an acute attack of pneumonia. Deceased had been a prominent citizen for many years and a citizen of Golden, holding several offices of honor and trust from his fellow citizens.

Mr. Millikin was born in Waynesboro, Pa., October 19, 1829. His early life was spent on a farm and in attending district schools. At the age of seventeen he served an apprenticeship at the carpenter trade, after which he engaged in contracting and building. In the Spring of 1857 he moved to Rock Eluff, Nebraska, and continued at his profession of contractor and builder until the Spring of 1860. He then crossed the plains to try his future in the new "Eldorado of the West", and located in Leavenworth Gulch, Gilpin County, where he engaged in mining for some several years and then removed to Golden, where he continued to reside until about one year ago, when in the hope of benefitting his condition he removed to Denver. As a contractor and builder, he executed several of the principal buildings of this city, notably the court house and one of our fine school buildings. While a resident here he was chosen Mayor of this city, and also served a term as county commissioner.

The remains were buried on Friday last in the Golden Cemetery, the funeral being attended by a large concourse of friends and relatives.

June 11. Bearce, General H. B.

The old pioneers of Golden were shocked at the announcement of the tragic death of General H. B. Bearce, which sad event occurred near Leadville Saturday last. He was shot by one Derry, on account of some dispute about their mining interests, and lived but a day or two afterwards. His remains were brought to Denver and buried there on Tuesday, all the various orders to which he belonged turning out at the funeral. General Bearce was one of the earliest pioneers of the state, coming here in 1859 from Boston. His murderer has given himself up to the authorities, but the dastardly act was witnessed by several parties and there can be no doubt of the fiendishness and premeditation of the murderer. But as Derry has plenty of money, we suppose he will be allowed to escape on a plea of emotional insanity or something else as it has already been given out that such will be the line of defence. Should such be the result of his trial, a little Cincinnati justice would not be amiss.

April 15. Breen, Charles.

Mr. Charles Breen, an old and respected citizen of Morrison, died on Saturday last, April 11, and was buried on Sunday the 12th. at the Golden Cemetery, the funeral being very largely attended by his neighbors and friends. Mr. Breen was formerly a citizen of Golden.

May 6. Powers, Michael.

Mr. Michael Powers, an old resident of Golden and Colorado, died at his residence in this city on Thursday last, at the advanced age of 74 years. Deceased was highly respected and leaves many relatives and warm friends to mourn his loss.

June 10. Hall, Maurice M.

It becomes our painful duty to announce the death of Comrade Maurice M. Hall, of T. H. Dodd Post, which occurred in this city on Friday last, after a long and painful illness which has caused a total disability for the last two or three years, he being totally blind and deaf. He leaves a loving and patient wife to mourn his death, who has been truly his staff during the whole of his protracted illness, and who has the sympathy of all who know her and of her affliction. Comrade Hall was a member of the 22nd. Indiana Veteran Volunteers during the war, and received a scalp wound which was supposed to be the cause of his disability and finally of his death. He was one of the earliest members of the Dodd Post, and was buried on Saturday under the auspices and with all the honors of the order. The services were held in the Methodist Church of which he was a member, by Rev. J. T. White, and at the Cemetery by officers of the Post. The comrades attended in a body. It is somewhat remarkable that this is the first death that has occurred among the members of Dodd Post since its organization, now more than six years since, particularly as its members must necessarily be well advanced in age. Comrade Hall was one of the youngest members of the organization, he being forty-one years of age at the time of his death.

August 19. Jennison, Mrs. Mary B.

Over the Dark River.

The people of Golden were greatly astonished and greatly pained at the announcement on Tuesday morning last of the sudden death of Mrs. Mary B. Jennison. Up to Sunday night she had been in her usual health, having attended church on that day and spent the evening until a late hour in social intercourse with her family and friends. During the night she suffered from a malignant attack of cholera-morbus, suffering through the night, and on Monday night she passed away.

The shock to her two daughters, Mrs. Cass and Mrs. Greathouse, who were with her was a fearful one as they had no idea the fell disease had so strong a hold upon her. This estimable lady was one of our oldest citizens, loved and respected by all who came in contact

with her genial and motherly nature, and few have passed to their reward so universally and sincerely mourned. The funeral which occurred on Tuesday afternoon at 3:00 o'clock at the residence of her son-in-law, Mr. B. S. Greathouse, was very largely attended by neighbors and friends. The Woman's Relief Corps of Dodd Post G. A. R., of which she was a loved and active member, attended in a body with full regalia. The floral tributes tendered in memory of the loved departed were numerous and wonderfully beautiful, one of the sweetest of which was a white cross, the tribute of the Relief Corps, in addition to which each member deposited a bouquet of sweet flowers on the coffin.

After a short service conducted by Rev. S. F. Davis, the remains were escorted to the Colorado Central Depot, to be forwarded to Muscatine Iowa, her old home for burial, accompanied by her daughter, Mrs. J. B. Cass, who will remain with her until the final sepulture.

We are furnished with the following tribute to the memory of deceased from an old and valued friend of the family:

Hark the whisper, Angels say,
"Sister Spirit, come away".

Died - At the residence of her son-in-law, B. F. Greathouse, in this city, with cholera morbus, after a short illness, at half past 11 o'clock, on Monday evening last, Mrs. Mary B. Jennison, widow of H. L. Jennison, Esq., deceased. The deceased was born in Pike Co., Ohio, in November, 1815, and was the daughter of Mr. Steenburger, a gentleman of high social standing in that state. Shortly after her marriage, she emigrated to Iowa, in company with Governor Lucas, a brother of her mother, who was appointed governor of Iowa Territory, he having formerly been governor of Ohio. In company with a large connection, they settled at Muscatine, where many of their descendants now reside, and where she and a few others established the Congregational Church and became a member of same, in which faith she died. At the close of the war in which her husband and two brothers participated, she emigrated to Colorado and has resided here ever since, with the exception of a few protracted visits to Iowa.

The deceased leaves two daughters, Mrs. J. B. Cass, of Denver, and Mrs. B. S. Greathouse, of this city, and a son who resides near Baxter Springs, Kansas. Mrs. Jennison was pre-eminently a pioneer woman, born in Ohio shortly after its admission, and subsequently resided in two territories, which she saw emerge from a chrysalis condition and take a proud position in the sisterhood of states.

September 9. Harsh, Dr. Levy.

Another Pioneer Gone. Sudden Death of Dr. Levy Harsh.

It becomes our painful duty to record the death of another of our old pioneers, an old and respected citizen of Golden, who passed to his rest on Monday night last, in the sixtieth year of his age.

Dr. Levy Harsh was born in Washington County, Pennsylvania, on May 24, 1826. When eight years of age, he moved with his parents to Ohio. He studied medicine at Carlton, in that state, and in 1852, removed to Steubenville, where he was married to Miss Mary M. Armstrong in 1854. In 1859 deceased moved to Colorado, having ever since been a resident of this state. He has also been a member of the legislature here, having at one session been chosen presiding officer.

Deceased has been an honored citizen of Golden, being largely interested in mining operations in Gilpin and Clear Creek counties. On Friday last he went to Denver upon some business connected with his mining operations, from which place he never returned alive. Word was received on Monday by his family that he was sick, and in the evening Mrs. Marsh drove down and had the melancholy satisfaction of being by his bed side at his death which occurred during the night Monday.

Deceased leaves a wife and two children in Golden to mourn his loss, a young son and a daughter, the latter recently married to Mr. Harry L. Clark of this city. The heartfelt sympathy of the whole community is with the bereaved ones. The remains were brought to this city on Tuesday evening for interment, and due notice of the time for the funeral will be given.

1886

January 18. Cook, John W.

We are pained to record the death of Mr. John W. Cook of this county at his residence near Ralston Creek, which occurred last week. Mr. Cook was one of our most enterprising farmers and fruit growers, having been very successful in starting a fruit farm. He will be greatly missed by the community in which he resided and throughout the country.

January 27. Sibley, W. F.

We are pained to chronical in this issue the death of Mr. W. F. Sibley who will be remembered as an old resident of Golden and at one time chief of our department. The sad event occurred in Denver last Monday from the effects of lead poisoning. The remains were brought to this city for interment.

February 17. Barnes, David.

It is with sincere regret that we announce the death of Mr. David Barnes, which occurred on his ranch near Loveland on Saturday last caused from a fall from a load of hay. Deceased was an old timer of Colorado, and for many years one of the most enterprising citizens of Golden. His family has the sincere sympathy of the entire community.

March 9.

The Grim Reaper.

Two of Jefferson County's Early Pioneers Passed
"Over the Range".

Death is beginning to make sad inroads in the ranks of our early pioneers, and we are often called to mourn their departure one by one. This week we are called to record the death of Col. Joseph T. Boyd and Judge O. A. Patterson, both among the earliest settlers of Colorado, and for a quarter of a century residents of Golden and Jefferson County. Both were prominent in their spheres of life and both are sincerely mourned by sorrowing relatives and hosts of fast friends.

Boyd, Col. Joseph T.

Died, at his residence in Denver on Sunday morning last at eight o'clock, having been confined to his bed for less than a week from an attack of pneumonia which terminated in congestion of the brain which set in on Saturday morning, after which time he was entirely unconscious until the moment of his death which occurred 28 hours afterward as stated above. Greatly to the sorrow of all he was not permitted to recognize his wife and children and the many relatives and friends about him to the slightest degree, although he lingered so many hours amid the greatest apparent suffering, finally passing away peacefully and without a struggle.

Deceased came to Colorado with his parents in June 1859, having at that time scarcely attained his majority, and was, during the past 25 years a resident of this county. In 1861 he enlisted in the 2nd. Colorado Volunteers with which he served until the consolidation of that regiment with the third, he being at the time Commissary Sergeant of the regiment. He was rendered supernumerary by the consolidation and mustered out. Returning to Colorado he joined the 3rd. Colorado Cavalry, a 100 day regiment then being raised for an Indian campaign and was commissioned as its commissary, serving with it in the battle of Sand Creek and other raids against the red devils who were then ravaging the country along our eastern border.

At the close of his service he returned to Golden and entered into the real estate business, always being prominent in politics and in matters for the promotion of the good of his county and city. He held many offices of honor and trust among the people by whom he was first known. He was active in the organization of the Eaton Guard of this city and was its first captain, serving in that capacity until his removal to Denver to assume the duties of private secretary to the governor.

During the campaign of 1884, Col. Boyd was an active worker for election of B. H. Eaton, with whom he had before served on the board of Penitentiary Commissioners, and upon the election of that gentleman accepted the position of private secretary and made himself very popular with both the governor and the people by his genial ways and methodical service. He was also appointed upon the staff of Governor Eaton with the rank of Colonel.

Deceased was also a member of the Dodd Post No. 3, G. A. R. of this city, and last fall was elected president of the Colorado Veterans' Association, comprising members of the various Colorado organizations which served in the war of the rebellion, and still held that

office at the time of his death.

One of the direct causes of the last illness of deceased was a trip taken by him some four weeks since to Garfield County after the remains of his youngest brother who had died at Carbondale of the same disease which he had. On that trip which was a severe one, on crossing the range he caught a severe cold, from which he never recovered and which finally ended in pneumonia.

His death occurred at his late residence, No. 1927 Lincoln Avenue, Denver, his bed side being attended by his sorrowing wife and three little boys, his only remaining brother, sisters, and other relatives, and many kind friends who were present to administer to his last hours. Prominent among these were Governor Eaton, Mr. W. J. McKay, and W. H. Young, his late partner in business, neither of whom left his bedside during all the long hours preceding his death.

The funeral will occur from the residence this afternoon at 1:30 and will be attended by the Colorado Veteran Association, under the command of Vice President Harper P. Orahoad, a delegation of Dodd Post of this city, and the order of United Workmen, of which he was a prominent member. The remains will be buried at Riverside.

Patterson, Hon. A. O.

This well known old citizen passed over to the silent majority on Sunday last at about 3:00 o'clock in the afternoon, after an illness of a little more than a week. His disease was pneumonia, contracted while he was in Denver and brought on by the severe cold and storm which occurred a couple of weeks ago. He died at his home in Golden attended by his wife and daughter and many loving and appreciative friends, and is sincerely mourned by all who have known him through a long and active life.

Andrew Cliphant Patterson was born in Washington County, Pennsylvania, and was educated at Jefferson College, choosing the law for a profession. After being admitted to the bar at Uniontown, Pa., he removed to Muscatine Iowa, where he practiced for a number of years. He was at one time President of the First National Bank at Muscatine, and during his residence there was always active in politics, and was elected twice to the legislature of the state. He removed to Colorado in '59, being joined here by his family in '61; and has been since continuously a resident of Golden, and was one or two years a member of the Legislature.

The funeral occurred from the late residence of the deceased on Fourth Street yesterday at 10 o'clock and was largely attended. Deceased leaves a wife and one daughter to mourn his loss.

1887

August 3. Berthoud, Helen S.

Died-In this city, on August 2, 1887, Helen S. Berthoud, age 57 years. It is with peculiar sadness that we announce the death of this assurable lady and extend our sympathies to the beloved and esteemed husband. Always foremost in every good work in the community during her long residence among us, she had won the hearts of everyone with whom she came in contact. Mrs. Berthoud came to Colorado with her husband in 1860 and has for 27 years been a resident of

Golden. When Capt. Berthoud became connected with the army during the late Civil War, she followed him to the field, and in the campaign in Missouri in '63 and '64 was at the front with him. She united with other ladies of the regiment in untiring ministrations to the sick and wounded in hospital and camp, and was always a welcome visitant to the boys in blue, both in sickness and in health. Deceased was the daughter of the late Col. John T. Ferrel, one of the first residents of Golden, was born at Oneida Castle, New York, October 19, 1830, and was married to Capt. E. L. Berthoud, at Logansport, Indiana, in 1856.

The funeral will occur to-morrow, Thursday August 4, at the Episcopal Church, of which she was a consistant member, at 10 o'clock in the fore noon. The last sad rites will be attended by the Woman's Relief Corps of the Dodd Post, G. A. R., of which organization she was an officer and hard working member. Dodd Post, of the Grand Army of the Republic will also attend in a body.

The illness which proved to be her last was of short duration, she having been attacked only on Thursday last. The disease was pronounced acute apoplexy with paralysis of the brain.

1838

February 15. Lake, Seth.

The old pioneers of Colorado are passing over the range with fearful rapidity, the last one being our esteemed friend and fellow townsman, the venerable Deacon Seth Lake, who died here in Golden on Wednesday last at the advanced age of 74 years and 11 months.

Deacon Lake was among the first settlers here, and has ever since resided among us with his family, and was highly esteemed by all who had the privilege of knowing him. He was always prominent in business and church matters, being one of the founders of the Baptist Church, the oldest church in the city. His genial greetings which he always had for everybody will be greatly missed.

May 23. Kelley, George W.

We are called upon this week to record the death of Mr. George Kelley, a brother of James Kelley, one of our oldest citizens. The deceased came to this county some years ago seeking relief from lung trouble. He improved so much that his friends were encouraged and believed that many years would be added to his life. Those with whom he came in contact found him a genial companion, pleasant in every relation in life. Two weeks ago he caught a severe cold, and came in from the ranch where he was staying to his brothers house, where he received every attention that affection and skill could give him, but in vain. He died on Sunday evening at 10 o'clock, aged 46 years and 11 months. The funeral took place yesterday and was attended by a large body of our citizens and the masonic order, of which he was an honored member.

June 20. Wooley, George.

Mr. George Wooley Shoots Himself and Bleeds to Death.

News was received here on Saturday last of the death by accident of Mr. George Wooley, of Guy Gulch in this county, the particulars of which are contained in the following letter from Mr. J. C. McKay, a son-in-law of the deceased. The letter is dated at Yampa, near the borders of Garfield and Routt Counties, where he was living taking care of his stock.

Yampa, Colorado,
June 10, 1888.

Messrs. Binder and Ward:

I write to inform you of the sad death that George W. Wooley met while out hunting. He was riding along on horse back and carried a 45-70 Winchester in front of him. He had a double cinch saddle on the horse, and in some way the back cinch slipped into the flanks of the horse, when she began kicking up and he attempted to get off. As he reached the ground on his feet, the lock of the gun caught in his saddle discharging the gun. The ball struck him in the right leg above the knee, going through, breaking the bone, and cutting the main artery from which he bled to death before medical aid could arrive. Dr. Worthington was notified at once, and he made all haste, but reached the side of the noble man only to find him dead.

J. C. McKay.

Mr. Wooley was an old citizen of this county, and highly respected by all who knew him. He was about 52 years of age, and leaves a wife and large family of children, several of whom are grown.

October 3. Hendrickson, Mrs. Charity C.

We are pained to record the death of Mrs. Charity C. Hendrickson, wife of our old and respected citizen, Mr. J. G. Hendrickson, aged 62 years. Her death occurred on Sunday of dropsy, and the funeral occurred on Monday. Deceased was among the earliest settlers of Golden, having come here with her husband and family in 1859, and has resided here ever since. She was the mother of Mrs. John B. Russell and Mrs. M. D. Parshall, and was highly esteemed by all who knew her.

November 7. York, Martin.

We owe an apology to the friends of the late Martin York for neglecting to notice his death in our last issue. He was formerly a resident of Golden and highly respected by all who knew him. His death occurred in Denver week before last, and his remains were buried on Sunday week, the funeral being largely attended by the different railroad associations.

November 14. Death of Judge Johnson.

Large attendance of Pioneers and Others.

Although expected for several weeks, the death of our old and most respected citizen, Judge J. M. Johnson, Sr. is a shock to this whole community. His death occurred on Thursday last, and the funeral occurred on Sunday, attended by a large concourse of people, many of whom came from Denver and outside precincts in this county. Rev. T. L. Bellam officiated.

Judge Johnson has been a resident of Golden since the earliest settlement of the town, having arrived here, we believe, on June 14th. 1859. Of the present residents of the city only one, the writer of this article- preceded him, we having arrived a couple of days before him. His residence here has been continuous, and no one in the community was more highly respected. Deceased has always been prominent in this community, and has held several offices of honor and trust in this city and county. He was 74 years of age at the time of his death and leaves a widow and several children and other relatives to mourn his loss. He was the father of Henry Johnson of Illinois, Ex-sheriff, J. M. Johnson Jr., Mrs. E. F. Rundlett, of this city, Mrs. J. P. Mallon, of Nebraska, and Mrs. C. P. Hoyt, of Canon City, all of whom were present at the funeral, except Henry and Mrs. Mallon.

We were glad to see a large number of Jefferson County pioneers in attendance, the number being remarkable considering the short notice. In compliance with a call, a meeting was held previous to the hour set for the funeral, and the following pioneers responded, all of whom were known to the deceased: Messrs: J. R. Ward, W. A. H. Loveland, C. C. Welch, E. B. Smith, C. H. Judkins, J. H. Deaver, Ashel Haines, W. C. Carroll, Thomas Crippen, James Hartzel, D. M. Murphy, John Clark, L. C. Rogers, Jonas Wannamaker, Stephen Bailey, J. B. C. Boyd, L. Peabody, Wm. Armor, Fred Buckman, J. G. Hendrickson, C. W. Lake, E. L. Berthoud, Dr. James Kelley, J. H. Titus, F. J. Mcquisten, A. Ronney, J. C. Wells, Jacob H. Brown, John H. Kinnear, D. G. Dargin, Henry Wagoner, Oliver Feah, Geo. West. The gentlemen present were called to order, and after remarks on the death of the deceased, the wish was expressed that a permanent organization be effected, and a meeting was set for the purpose, one week from Saturday next, at this place.

On motion Geo. West, was chosen president of the association Pro. Tem. and Charles W. Lake was chosen secretary and treasurer.

Mourning badges were furnished to each pioneer present, and they proceeded in a body to the late residence of the deceased to participate in the obsequies. After the services at the house the association escorted the funeral cortege to the outskirts of the town.

This was one of the largest funerals that has occurred in Golden, there being nearly sixty carriages in the procession, showing the high esteem in which our dead brother was held in the community where he has lived for the last thirty years.

On Saturday evening last, in Lake's and Vivians store conversation turned upon the fact that no one for several days had seen "old Taylor" about the street. It was known that he lived alone in a little cabin on first street, and it was deemed strange that he had not been seen about. After further conversation Charles Johnson and Mr. Mencimer started out to visit his cabin and ascertain if possible of his whereabouts. Upon opening the door and striking a match the poor old fellow was found upon his bed dead-. His face, whiskers and bed clothes were besmeared with clots of blood, undoubtedly from a hemorrhage. The discovery was reported to city Marshal Dargin and Mr. Davidson, the undertaker, who will see that he has a decent burial.

Deceased's name was Louis M. Taylor, and he must have been 60 years of age. He was a stone mason by trade, and has lived in Golden for the last 22 or 23 years. For the last dozen or more he has lived alone, gaining a precarious livelihood by doing odd jobs for people who would furnish him with the wherewithall to procure liquor, to the use of which he had become greatly addicted.

But little is known of the history of the deceased, only that he has a brother by the name of Milton Taylor, who has an extensive ranch between Fort Collins and Cheyenne on the old Colorado Central line, near a place called Taylor's Siding. Some years ago his brother's wife was here and endeavored to induce him to go home with her, but he flatly refused. His brother has been written to and if word reaches him, doubtlessly will attend to the last sad rites, as he is supposed to be well able to do so.

(Cheyenne and Ft. Collins papers are requested to notice the above.)

Later- The funeral took place on Tuesday from Davidson's undertaking room, Rev. Mr. Bewley officiating. Mr. Milton Taylor the brother referred to above arrived here on the morning of the funeral, and attended to everything necessary to give him a respectable burial. From him we learned that Louis Taylor was a pioneer in Colorado. We learn, also from the records in the Adjutant General's office that he was a member of the 3rd. Colorado Cavalry and participated in the battle of Sand Creek in the raid upon the Indians in '64. This fact was not ascertained until too late for Dodd Post G. A. R. to take part in the burial, or he would doubtless have been laid in the soldiers lot in the Golden Cemetery, No one here knew before that he had been a soldier.

1889

May 22. Churches, Mrs. John.

Death of a Pioneer Lady.

We are pained to announce that the lingering illness of Mrs. John Churches of Ralston, noticed in the paper a week or two since, terminated in her death last Thursday. Deceased was 72 years of age at her death and had been an old-time resident of this county, having located here in this county 27 years ago, with her husband. The funeral occurred on Sunday last. Services were held at Calvary Episcopal Church and were

more largely attended than any funeral we have ever witnessed in a long time. Her maiden name was Mary Ann Colipriert, born Sept. 17, 1817 in Golden in the parish of Mear, county of Summerset, England; was confirmed in St. John Episcopal Church, Glastonburg, at the age of fourteen, by the Right Rev. Lord Henry George Law, of the diocese of Bath and Wells. She was the mother of eight children, of which three sons and two daughters are still living. Mrs. Churches was one of the Charter members of Enterprise Grange, held the office of ceres four terms, and was Pomona in the State Grange, and ceres in the Pomona Grange No.1, ceres in Enterprise Grange, and had never missed a meeting since the organization was begun. A large number of members of the grange were in attendance at the funeral in the regalia of the order.

Quaintance, Mr. Jesse.

We are pained to announce the death on Monday morning last, in this city, of our esteemed fellow citizen townsman, Mr. Jesse Quaintance, at the advanced age of 84 years. Deceased has been an active business man of Golden since 1874, coming here from Crawford County, Ohio, where he was born. The funeral occurred yesterday and was largely attended.

December 11. Carpenter, Chester C.

Death of Judge Carpenter.

Last Thursday evening the whole community was shocked at the announcement of the demise of Judge Chester C. Carpenter, after a lingering and painful illness, from Bright's disease of the kidneys. Although the sad news of his illness was out, his death was not altogether expected.

Judge Carpenter has been a prominent figure in Golden and Jefferson county for nearly 30 years, having settled in this town early in 1860, and has resided among us continuously ever since. He has held several public offices here for the past eight years previous to 1888 holding the important position of Judge of the 1st. Judicial District.

We have known him intimately for the past many years of his residence here, and can sympathize deeply with his family in their inseparable loss. He leaves a wife and two daughters to mourn his death.

Deceased was a prominent member of the Masonic fraternity, and was buried on Saturday last under their auspices. He was 55 years of age.

1890

August 20. Sarell, Mr. John.

We are pained to learn of the death in Chicago last week, of Mr. John Sarell. Deceased was an old printer and publisher, and was for several years engaged in the business in Colorado. He resided for

some time in Golden, and started the Golden Eagle here, which was the predecessor of the Globe. For some ten years he had been a resident of Chicago, where he died of heart disease at the age of 70 years.

September 10. Murphy, Mr. D. M.

Another Pioneer gone.

It becomes our painful duty to announce the taking off by death of another of Golden's earliest and most highly respected settlers. On Wednesday last Mr. D. M. Murphy passes away at his home on Ralston Creek, a few miles north of Golden, at the age of 62 years.

Mr. Murphy came to Golden with his young wife in '59 and made themselves a home here, partaking with the founders of our now prosperous state in all the early struggles of the pioneers. The writer of this knew them intimately from their first arrival among us, and mourns the death as one of an old and valued friend.

Deceased was the discoverer and owner of the once celebrated "Murphy Coal Mines", on Ralston Creek, which his energy developed and which were for a number of years about the only source of supply for this whole region of the country.

Owing to adverse circumstances these mines have been worked for several years, but Mr. Murphy had continued to reside with his family upon the premises and to "hold the fort" for future development.

A widow and three children, a daughter and two sons, are left to mourn the loss of a loving father and husband, and they are sympathized with by the whole community with whom he has lived for so many years of his useful life.

The funeral occurred on Saturday last in this city, the services being held at the Catholic church and was attended by a large concourse of people from the country and city, including all the old pioneers that could be gotten together.

September 17. Drake, Mr. J. L.

We have the news of the death of Mr. J. L. Drake, formerly a prominent citizen of this country, having resided for many years on Bear Creek near Morrison. His death occurred from heart disease in Denver on the 8th. inst. the funeral occurred on the 10th. The remains were interred at Riverside.

1891.

February 21. Binder, Joachim

The last sad rites were paid to the remains of Joachim Binder last Monday. He was buried in the Golden cemetery from the St. Joseph's church. Mr. Binder will be greatly missed in business circles here in Golden. He came here in the early 60's, and while living on his farm near town was engaged in business here a part of the time.

March 7. Blood, Mr, L. C.

Last Tuesday night Mr. L. C. Blood met with a most serious accident on his road home. He left Golden about 5:30 for home and as

he was driving in the dark up Golden Gate Road his team probably gave him some trouble as it backed his wagon over the side of the road. He fell about twelve feet and was bruised up terribly, and knocked insensible in which condition he lay until found the next morning. Dr. Perry Kelly was summoned and Mr. Blood was taken home. The bones over his eyes had to be taken out also the bones of the nose and a part of the left cheek bone. He lived until Thursday morning. Mr. Blood was one of the first settlers in Colorado, coming here in 1850. The funeral will take place on Sunday morning from the Methodist Church at 10 o'clock.

April 11. Hall, Mr. J. T.

Mr. J. T. Hall died in Leadville on Monday last of pneumonia, for a number of years he was a resident of Golden and employed on the railroad. His sudden death was a sudden shock to his numerous friends in this city where he was a universal favorite. The body was brought to Golden on Wednesday morning, the funeral occurring from the Baptist Church at 2:00 that day, under the auspices of the Knights of Pythias. He leaves a wife and two little children beside other relatives and hosts of friends, and to these the sincerest sympathies of all are extended.

May 9. Patterson, Mrs. M. A.

Mrs. M. A. Patterson, widow of the late Hon. A. C. Patterson, died in Denver on Wednesday morning last. She had been at the hospital there for several weeks, receiving treatment, Mrs. Patterson had been a resident of Golden for many years and her loss is sincerely mourned by all. The funeral occurred on Friday from her late residence in this city and was largely attended by friends from both Denver and here. In the death of Mrs. Patterson, Golden has lost one of its most beloved and oldest of its citizens, the Presbyterian church one of its first and most faithful members. No one knew her but to love her, and her name will long be fragrant in the memory of her many friends. At her funeral Dr. Bliss selected as his text the 26th. verse of the 31st. chapter of proverbs. "She opened her mouth with wisdom, and in her tongue was the law of kindness". Her life here for many years was a continual illustration of this passage. Her heart was always open in tenderness and sympathy to all in sorrow, her deeds of kindness were bestowed without ostentation and her daily walk of life adorned the gospel of Christ which she had so long professed and loved. "Blessed are the pure of heart, for they shall see God." The sympathies of this whole community are with her deeply afflicted daughter, her only remaining child, and other relatives of the family.

July 25. Robinson, Mr. George

Last Wednesday Mr. George Robinson died at his home near Forks Creek. Mr. Robinson was one of the old timers that came to Colorado in 1859. He was 72 years of age and his death will be a great loss to his many friends. He was buried Friday.

September 12. Brinkerhoff, Mrs.

The sad news was received Saturday by telegraph that Mrs. Brinkerhoff was dead. The remains were followed to the grave at the Arvada Cemetery on Monday by a large number of friends. She was the mother of James Brinkerhoff, an old resident of Jefferson County.

August 20. Smith, Mrs. Lucy Fidelia.

Died, in Golden on Monday, Aug. 15th. Mrs. Lucy Fidelia Smith, at the home of her son, Hon. W. G. Smith. The immediate cause of death was a stroke of paralysis. Deceased had been a resident of Golden for about twenty years, and gained the love and respect of every one by her genuine christian character. The funeral services were held at the house on Wednesday at 3 o'clock p.m., conducted by the Rev. R. M. L. Braden, assisted by Rev. R. E. Briggs and S. T. Davis. Many friends of the family from abroad were present. They were Rev. S. T. Davis and daughter Minnie, of Missouri Valley, Iowa, L. S. Smith and wife of Aspen Colorado, Mrs. W. B. Wentworth, Rev. Furgerson and Messrs. A. G. Brooks, A. J. King, Wm. C. Miller and H. A. Sumner of Denver. Mrs. Smith had lived to the ripe age of 82 years. Her death was peaceful and serene, such an exit of life as leaves an enduring impression on those who are witnesses that over the threshold of the beyond, rest and sweet peace abide. Mrs. Smith had been an invalid for several years, and during those years was cared for by a loving son and his wife. It will be lonesome in the home, to see the vacant chair and to miss the kindly face and voice.

September 3. Hyatt, Mr. Arthur Lawrence.

Died at his home in Golden on Saturday evening, Aug. 27, 1898 of a stomach disease, after a short and sudden illness, Mr. Arthur Lawrence Hyatt, at the age of 38 years. The news of his death came as a shock to this community in which deceased was so well known. It seemed but a day or so that we saw him pass along the street seemingly robust and sound except for his life long lameness. The funeral which occurred at home was an imposing one and fully five hundred people attended, many coming from Ralston where deceased once lived. The services were conducted by Rev. Sudden Death.

Arvada, Colo.

B.F.Wadsworth, a well known Old Resident of this county,
Fatally Injured in a Run Away Accident.

Arvada, Colo., Apr. 13.

The startling news was received yesterday afternoon that our esteemed fellow citizen, B.F.Wadsworth had been thrown from his carriage while driving near the corner of 15th. and Glenarm Streets, and fatally injured. A.H.Robbins immediately started to Denver with Mrs. Wadsworth, but they were not able to reach St. Lukes Hospital, where Mr. Wadsworth had been taken, in time to see him alive. He was coming down the hill on Colfax Avenue, as we understand it, when a dog ran out and frightened the colt which he was driving, and after a fierce struggle with the frantic animal in which he displayed his well known and remarkable horsemanship he was thrown out and his skull badly fractured at the base of the brain. He lived from 12:30 to 4:40, but never regained consciousness.

Mr. Wadsworth has been identified with our history since the first settlement of Arvada. There is not a citizen who has not been helped and blessed by the means and example of this almost perfect life.

The hush of death rests over us like a pall. Rough, hard men who seem never to have never to have been moved to reveal the slightest touch of sentiment, are quietly weeping. Every citizen feels the loss of a father, a friend and a guide. This morning the white snow covers the ground like the emblem of pure life that went out from us.
