A native New Yorker, she and her husband both served in the Air Force and lived in numerous places in the US and abroad.


UPCOMING GENEALOGY MEETINGS

You Can Help the U.S. Government Create the Historical Record of the **Environment**

The Environmental Protection Agency has issued a challenge that should appeal to all genealogists: take pictures of your surrounding environment to become part of historical record. By creating pictures of the environment today and adding them to the historical record, you can help document changes. The result should help your descendants and all future generations.

The EPA's Locations Challenge looks to update a 40-year old agency project known as 'Documerica' which included more than 15,000 photographs of images of American environmental problems and everyday life. In the 1970s the EPA hired freelance photographers to capture images relating to environmental problems for the project. With recent budget cuts, hiring hundreds of photographers is no longer an option. However, the EPA hopes to continue, and even expand, the project through the efforts of volunteers. This "crowd sourcing" could improve the project far beyond what it has been in the past. The "challenge" from the EPA states: "Choose an original Documerica photo either from the ones we post for each challenge or one you find yourself. Go to the location where that Documerica photo was taken, possibly even the exact spot where that photographer stood to take the photo 40+ years ago, and re-take a current photo of the same scene."

Read more about the photo on Flickr, for additional clues about location or subject matter that might help you. If the challenge includes more than one Documerica photo, choose one or as many as you like. The EPA will select photos that best show the new "after" view of the same original "before" Documerica photo. Original Documerica images can be seen at http://goo.gl/GcBxW

Former President John Tyler's (1790-1862) **Grandchildren Still Alive**

How many people born in 1790 have living grandchildren today? Not great-grandchildren, but second generation descendants? John Tyler was born in 1790 and became the 10th US President in 1841. Tyler fathered Lyon Gardiner Tyler in 1852, at age 63. Then at age 71 Lyon Gardiner Tyler fathered Lyon Gardiner Tyler Jr. in 1924 and four years later, at age 75, Harrison Ruffin Tyler. Both men are still alive today.

RootsTech Conference Report

Dick Eastman attended the RootsTech Conference in Salt Lake City February 2-4 along with more than 4400 genealogists. Here are some of his insights from the first day: The keynote speech was given by Jay Verkler, past CEO of Family Search. Some statistics he shared:

- Roughly 6 billion people were born from 1750-1900
- Roughly 14 billion people have been born since 1900
- By 2060 about 20 billion will have been born since 1900
- Most of us already have personal memory, records, and even photos of most of these later individuals.

This focus on ancestors born in the 1700s and 1800s will continue, even as the population increases and as the Internet makes records available to more people.

Jay made a comment that sticks in Eastman's mind: "Genealogy must be a collaborative experience." After all, our ever-expanding number of genealogists is focusing on the same pool of ancestors. FamilySearch is developing new software tools and methodologies to assist in this collaboration.

Several announcements from Jay:

- A second archive location is to be built to create a digital duplicate of the records presently stored in the Granite Mountain near Salt Lake City. The new location has not yet been announced.
- A new GEDCOM is being developed by FamilySearch. The new GEDCOM standard is being called GedcomX.

Mocavo Rolls Out New Content & Features

Genealogy search engine Mocavo announced searchable content additions and new capabilities in conjunction with the RootsTech conference. Content additions include:

*Allen County Public Library's Internet Archive records

* Social Security Death Index

Geni.com's World Family Tree

The new features are:

*Historical Record Storage & Sharing Platform: You can self-publish high-resolution documents to Mocavo.com for free. They're automatically digitized using Optical Character Recognition, and if you choose, your documents will be searchable by all Mocavo users.

*Mocavo is releasing iPhone and Android applications (not yet available, but promised within the next 30 days) that let you upload photos of documents and family pictures to the aforementioned document sharing platform. You also can use the app to search with Mocavo's Search

*The Mocavo Discovery Stream will deliver a constant source of new user-generated content—whether people are uploading family trees and documents or finding matches using the search engine—similar to the Facebook newsfeed or Pinterest.


