400th Anniversary of the Marriage of Pocahontas and John Rolfe, April 5, 2014

Your Governor enjoyed attending the elaborate interpretation of the wedding of Pocahontas to John Rolfe in Jamestown on April 5. The event was part of the *World of Pocahontas* Initiative at Historic Jamestowne — a series of public programs, lectures, and an exhibit opening on June 6 to highlight the 400th anniversary of the marriage of Pocahontas. The wedding commemoration took place on the site of the church where the couple married in 1614. The 1608 church site (between the Historic Church Tower and the John Smith statue) was uncovered in 2010 by Jamestown Rediscovery archaeologists.

At a Wedding Eve dinner held at the Williamsburg Lodge on April 4, I had the good fortune to share a table with other Jamestowne members and several of the archaeologists. It was quite an enjoyable evening in the company of interesting people doing fascinating work. On Saturday morning, I encountered several of my dinner companions at their work at Jamestown — starting a new excavation, and setting the new exhibition at the Archaearium. I also ran into Jamestowne Society office manager, Bonnie Hofmeyer, at the wedding!

Pocahontas and the Indian members of the wedding party were portrayed by members of the Pamunkey tribe. Seventy volunteers spent more than 1200 hours creating the bride's embroidered wedding jacket, inspired by "the Falkland Jacket," a 17th century waistcoat in the Victoria and Albert Museum in London. The embroidery design depicts flora and fauna specific to Virginia. Members of the wedding party reflected on the social, political, and cultural implications of this union of Old and New Worlds.
