FOREWORD

Ancestors have been of interest to me since childhood, and serious collection and study began in 1952-53. First, my father and mother lived with Francis Marion Duckworth, who had no children. He passed on early history of the family in North Carolina and Georgia to my parents, who passed it on to me. The most important item was John Williamson Duckworth, father of Francis Marion Duckworth. John Williamson Duckworth had a first cousin, James Duckworth, who was a Baptist preacher near Brevard, North Carolina. From that point on it has been search and study, compare and change data in the areas of Transylvania, Burke, and Mecklenburg Counties, North Carolina. All by the name Duckworth in these counties were recorded in census, church, newspaper, and war records, as well as the individual stories of their descendants.

Correspondence with Ms. Roberta Wakefield, past president of the National Genealogical Society, and with the late W.B. Duckworth, Attorney, 2126 East 24, Tulsa, Oklahoma (3-16-57), the first serious researchers of the family that I know of, encouraged me with my study. Then in the 1960s I was contacted by Malcolm Gardner, descendant of Williams Duckworth of Anson County, North Carolina, Pendleton District, South Carolina, Mississippi, and Arkansas. Mr. Malcolm Gardner was with the U.S. Park Service and had majored in history in college. In my opinion, Mr. Gardner was a first class researcher and the first thorough researcher of the records of the Duckworth family. He was careful not to make any statements not backed up with official records. He did much research of the family in Burlington County, New Jersey, Frederick County, Virginia, Cumberland County, North Carolina, and Pendleton District, South Carolina. The correspondence with Ms. Wakefield and W.B. Duckworth and copies of much of the research of Malcolm Gardner are included in "The Duckworth Collection."

In 1990, I submitted several pounds of correspondence, research notes, family briefs, outlines, etc. to the Mormon Family Library, Salt Lake City, Utah, for microfilming. It is known as "The Duckworth Collection." Copies of the collection may be obtained through interlibrary loan at any Mormon Church library. Also, copies of "The Duckworth Collection" have been placed in the Burke County Library, Morganton, North Carolina, The Brevard Library, Brevard, North Carolina, The East Tennessee Historical Society Library, Knoxville, Tennessee, and The Young Harris College Library, Young Harris, Georgia.

No effort to publish any history of the family is planned. A brief outline of the family was given to the families of my father's brothers and sisters. This paper will not be published but will be distributed to relatives and other interested people on computer diskettes. One

can take the diskette and add his or her branch of the family.

In closing, let me say this has been an interesting study and undertaking. Over the years I have met some very interesting people, but the greatest enjoyment was being able to pass on to others those items which have been obtained by careful research.

Chapter 1

EARLY DUCKWORTHS IN AMERICA

One of the earliest records of a Duckworth in America was John Duckworth. Under a four-year indenture, John Duckworth was one of 23 persons "imported into this province Registered in the secretary's books of Records," 1 December 1684, upon the account of Wm Dockwra" (Archives of ... New Jersey, first series, v.21, p. 61). William Dockwra (Dockray, Docwrae) was a London merchant and one of the proprietors of East Jersey.

The personal estate of William Duckworth, yeoman, of New Hanover Township, Burlington County, New Jersey, was appraised at L88 - 9 - 6, 7 March 1727/8, by Asher Clayton, John Wright, and Jonathan Fowler. On 15 March 1727/28 William Cook gave bond as administrator of the estate. His accounting of 22 March 1730/1 included charges for "sundrys furnished to the widow in her last sickness," two coffins and digging two graves (Archives of ... New Jersey, first series, v., 23, p. 144). In the May term 1728 the County Court confirmed William Bowgar and William Dean, who were appointed by Grace Duckworth, widow, during her last illness, as guardians for Joseph, Anna, and Mary Duckworth (Burlington Co., N.J., Minutes of Common Pleas, 1717-1733, p. 330). These three seem under 14; usually orphans under age, but 14 or over, chose their own guardians.

William Duckworth b. 1709 in Burlington County, New Jersey d. 30 January 1761 in Chester County, Pennsylvania, m. 1 Mary Wright in Burlington, New Jersey and they were the parents of: Uriah b. January 1734/35; Sarah b. 1739; Grace b. 1741; Aaron b. 28 January 1741/42; and Rody b. 1743. All born in Burlington, New Jersey.

William Duckworth left his wife Mary and children in New Jersey when he went to Virginia and presumably was a resident of Frederick County by October 1750 when a

235 acre grant was surveyed for him in Lord Fairfax's Northern Neck proprietary. In March 1753, the Frederick County Court named William Duckworth overseer, a position he held at the time of his death in 1761, and he also served as constable and juror. William Duckworth of Frederick County, Virginia died between 10 and 30 January 1761, while on a trip to Chester County, Pennsylvania. His will left his Virginia property to wife Easlie (Alice, Elsie) and his New Jersey property "in Trent Town: to "my five children...Uriah, Aaron, Sarah, Grace, and Rodey Duckworth" (Duckworth Notes in Virginia by Malcolm Gardner in "The Duckworth Collection").

JOHN DUCKWORTH, FREDERICK COUNTY, VIRGINIA

Although Frederick County was authorized in 1738 to be cut off from Orange, the new county court was not functioning before 1742. In the first 25 years of Frederick County operations, there appear in its records as adult residents at least two, possibly three John Duckworths, a Joseph Duckworth, and two William Duckworths.

On 31 August 1744, the Frederick County Court ordered that John Duckworth and 18 others "& the male Labouring Tithables belonging to them work on the Road where the said [Robert] McKay is now Overseer & Observe his Direction & Orders in Clearing the said Road as the Law Directs."

In an action in debt, 8 March 1744/45, Daniel Stillwell vs. John Duckworth, the defendant Duckworth "Confest Judgement to the Plt. for Eight pounds Ten shillings Pensilvania Money of the Value of Six pounds Seven shillings & Six pence Curr. Money of Virga." On John Duckworth's complaint in 1748 the Sheriff attached a cow, furniture, and other personal property of Mathias Ardis; the Court ordered the property sold and Duckworth to have his account of L 1 - 12 - 9 and costs (Frederick Co., Va., Order Books 1, pp. 170, 285; 2, p. 463).

In February Court 1748/49, John Duckworth was appointed "Overseer of the Road from the County Road to the Chapple at McCoys Spring," and in the following month the road from "Cedar Creek to Robert McCoys Run" seems added to his district. In February, a John Duckworth was "appointed Constable for the ensuing year." In June 1755, a John Duckworth was named as overseer of the road "from Captain Jacob Funks to his house," apparently indicating him as a landholder, but the compiler has seen no record of his owning real property (Ibid., Order Books 3, pp. 18,46; 4, p. 377, 6, p. 311).

John Duckworth seems to have spent little time in court, mostly an occasional action in debt (Ibid., Order Books 3, p. 219; 4, p. 165; 5, p. 312). In June 1759, John Hite's action "In Debt" against John Duckworth came before the Court; "The Dft being dead the Suit is Ordered to Abate (ibid., Order Book 8, p.276). The compiler is uncertain if this last is an example of a very slow docket or if it refers to a John Duckworth other than the one who died intestate before 5 April 1757, leaving a widow Sarah who administered his estate (ibid., Order Books 7, p. 221; 9, p. 276). On 4 March 1761, John Larich, Jr. was named road overseer "from McHays Chapple to the widow Duckworths," indicating that a John

Duckworth's widow was then still living (ibid., Order Book 9, p. 267).

On 4 April 1753, "Given under my hand and seal of the proprietors office," G.W. Fairfax authorized Robert Rutherford to make a survey: "Whereas John Duckworth of Frederick County hath informed that there are about Four Hundred Acres of Waste, and ungranted L, in the Said County adjoining the No Side of Casper Mires Late Survey on Drie Run - And desiring a Warrant to survey the same in order to obtain a Deed, ... provided this be the first Warrant that hath been issued for the same...." Rutherford's survey plat, with description, is dated 18 April 1753: "Pursuant to a warrant from the Proprietors office granted to John Duckworth I have surveyed for the said Duckworth" 480 acres in said County "on the westerly side of Shannandoah, on a branch of Crooked Run, ... [joining] Land Surveyed for Samuel Morse ...for Capt John Hite ... for Casper Mire." Chainmen were "Saml Morse & Edward Cartmel." No further action seems to have been taken on final title until after the Revolution. Then similar notations are added to the outside fold of each of the old 1752 survey warrant and plat: "John Duckworth ...480 acres ... 29 Sep. 1789," (Northern Neck Surveys, Frederick Co., Va., Box D-E, John Duckworth) Malcolm Gardner notes.

Chapter 2

JOHN and SARAH HANKINS DUCKWORTH

John Duckworth was a farmer in Frederick County, Virginia and died there in 1755-57. His widow, Sarah Hankins Duckworth, and children removed to Mecklenburg County, North Carolina shortly before 1768. It is believed that she was the Sarah Duckworth who married John Hern in Lincoln County, North Carolina, 9 October 1769. Sarah Duckworth, 1702-1804, died in Lincoln County, North Carolina and is buried in Olney Presbyterian Cemetery, Gastonia, North Carolina. Beside her is buried Rebecca Duckworth Mendenhall, 1748 23 March 1836, wife of Nathan Mendenhall.

John and Sarah Duckworth's children were: Sally, William, John, Simon, and Rebecca.

Duckworth family tradition is that John Duckworth (1759-1843) was related to John Neill (b. ca. 1740) and came to what is now Burke County when he was 12 or 13 years old with John Neill.

John Neill had four children as follows: William, John who left Burke County and no record, James, and Frankie who married Robert Scott.

William Neill (1771-1884), son of John, married Elizabeth Mackey (1773-1856) and had the following children: Nancy, John, Thomas, William, James, and George Duckworth.

James Neill (1775-1857), son of John, married in 1813 Margaret Morrison (1782-1848), daughter of Thomas and Sarah Duckworth Morrison, and had the following children:

James Jasper, Thomas Newton (1854-1939) married Christine Pearson, Sarah Eleanor, Margaret Elizabeth, Mary Jo married ----- Tate, and Zemma married ----Espey.

Thomas Newton and Christine Pearson Neill had the following children: Thomas Robinson, Lena, Patton Young, Gertrude, Esau, Margaret, and Beth.

Note: John Neill, son of Capt. John and Sallie Duckworth Neill, removed to McMinn County, Tennessee and on to Stone County, Missouri.

William Duckworth married Jane and will be discussed in the next chapter.

John Duckworth was married several times but the names of his wives have been lost. However, the first wife may have been Violet last name unknown. He had a large family. Absalome married 1. Martha Peele 2. Kiza Williams. He withdrew to Posey County, Indiana and later to Kentucky. George married Kathy Unknown and withdrew to Bath County, Kentucky. John J. married Mary Hill and withdrew to Indiana. Able Hankins married Mary Caruthers and withdrew to Lincoln County, North Carolina, to that part of Buncombe County that became Henderson County, North Carolina, and to Lincoln County, Tennessee. Alexander married Nina Silvey who withdrew to Rutherford County, North Carolina, where he died, and his widow and children withdrew to that part of Union County, Georgia that became Fannin County. From Fannin County the son, Robert, withdrew to Benton County Arkansas, where he died, and his widow, Lucinda Hall, removed to Coryell County Texas. William Smith Duckworth, son of John of Mecklenburg County, North Carolina, was probably the father of John, Hezekiah, and William of Rhea and Meigs Counties, Tennessee. Ezekiel married Malinda Shelton and removed to Pickens County, Alabama. There were other children whose names have been lost.

A DEED: Henry McCulloh to John Duck of Mecklenburg County, Planter. 1767. For 8 lbs. proclamation money. Tract of land in Mecklenburg County lying on the head branches of McDowell's Creek - beginning at a red oak, a corner - to a hickory in McCulloh's line - to a post near the side of the branch - to the old Brank's line - containing 110 acres. Mecklenburg County, North Carolina Deed Book 15, p. 83. [Probably the earliest Duckworth land purchase in Mecklenburg County, North Carolina. JFD]. He sold this land to John McKnitt Alexander of Mecklenburg County in 1797. This land joining or near the Grant of 200 acres to John Duckworth, heir at law to William Duckworth in 1773 and sold to John McKnitt Alexander in 1795 by John Duckworth of Burke County, North Carolina.

John Duckworth was fined for non-attendance at Court, Oct. 1774, and in June 1775 is named as security for Joseph Maxwell's license for an ordinary (Mecklenburg County, North Carolina Minute Book 1, 1774-1780, pp. 9, 19). He was appointed Constable in July 1775, place of John Barry in the district of Richard Barry, Esq., and was still Constable in April 1778 (Ibid., pp. 54, 58, 149). July 1781 Constable in Samuel Blythes' District.

Duckworth, John. Mecklenburg County. He is blind, poor, between 80 and 90; his children have all moved to the Western Country except one daughter "whose circumstance is too humble to render him any relief." The details of his service are supported by Col. William Polk [Not included in the Delamar Transcriptions]. (In the Senate 19 Dec. 1825. L.P.382). (North Carolina Genealogical Society Journal, Vol. IV, #1, p. 42)

Duckworth, John. Revolutionary Soldier was wounded at battle of Stono under Gen. Lincoln, now 86 years old, has been blind for 2 years. Simon Duckworth, David Davies, and John Davidson, Sr., certify this is true. John Duckworth makes mark. No other information. (L.P 383) (The North Carolina Genealogical Society Journal Vol. III, #4, Nov. 1977).

John Duck, a soldier of the Revolution, upwards age 80, died 28 December 1826, Mecklenburg County Newspaper, dated January 23, 1827.

David Lawing [son-in-law?] was appointed administrator of the estate of John Duckworth, Mecklenburg County, North Carolina, 29 February 1827. Thomas and George Duckworth, bondsmen [sons of Simon Duckworth]. Sales for the estate 17 March 1827 totaled \$43.211 1/2 and a note on Dan'l McAulay for \$10.00.

Records show a "William Duckworth" and a John Duckworth in September 1758 in the Roster of Captain Thomas Speak's Company of the Frederick County Militia and was at the time named in an appropriation bill as due 8 Shillings for "Services for the defense of the Frontiers of this Colony. [W. A. Crozier, Virginia Colonial Militia, 1651 - 1776; W. W. Hening, Statues at Large....Laws of Virginia, v 7, page 217].

Simon Duckworth married Mary Unknown, . On 12th Oct. 1787, he bought 320 acres on N. side of Catawba River, Mecklenburg County, North Carolina, from Charles Moore of Spartanburg County, South Carolina, and here he and Mary died.

Simon Duckworth, born 1739-1746, died ante 06 Feb 1827 (1799 Poll Tax List - 1 poll-if under 60 years; if over 60 no poll). Their children were:

1. Robert White Duckworth b. 1777 d. 1858. Married Elizabeth Alexander; had two sons and eight daughters; went to Tennessee between 1821-30; in Haywood County, Tennessee by 1840. Served in War of 1812. Sons: William Wilkins and Alexander. His grandson, William LaFayette Duckworth, is here included. He died of a heart attack at the age of 80 years and seven months. He was a Colonel of the 7th Tennessee Regiment of Cavalry under General Forrest in the Confederate Army in the Civil War.

After the war, he graduated at Philadelphia School of Medicine and practiced his profession a number of years. Later in life he entered the ministry of the Methodist Church and for a long period was a successful pastor.

An excerpt from "War of The Rebellion"- Hdqrs. First Div., Forrest's Cav. Dept. -

Oxford, Miss. April 20, 1864 Soldiers: "It is with pride and pleasure that I review the part taken by the soldiers of this division in this decisive campaign. Colonel Duckworth, of the Seventh Tennessee, by a successful ruse at Union City, made the enemy believe that Maj. General Forrest was present and compelled the surrender of the place by Hawkins and his regiment of renegade Tennesseans, with all their arms, horses, and equipment." (Signed) James R. Chalmers, Brigadier-General, Commanding."

2. William Duckworth b. after 1774. The same S.W. Duckworth d. 07 Jan 1861, 78yrs of age (b. 1783) and buried at Gilead Church Cemetery in extreme NW Mecklenburg County, North Carolina. And the same who was Administrator of the Estate of Alexander and Margaret Duckworth, Mecklenburg County, North Carolina 23 Nov. 1818? Margaret was daughter of Alexander Allen - his Will - Mecklenburg County, North Carolina, 15 Sept 1818.

3. Elizabeth Duckworth b. 1784-94 d. by 1861 - Spinster.

4. Margaret Duckworth b. 1784-94 - Spinster.

5. Thomas Duckworth b. 1792. Was in War 1812 and resided in Gaston County, North Carolina when he applied for bounty land (1855). He had eight children. See 1891 Special Proceedings, Mecklenburg County North Carolina and 1850 Census, Hopewell District, Mecklenburg County, North Carolina.

6. Mary Duckworth b. 1798-1800. Married William Hunt, 1816, wt. George Duckworth. Thomas Duckworth and William Hunt chain bearers for land survey 08 Sept 1827 and Deed issued 19 Nov 1828 for 3 acres on Dempsey's Creek, Mecklenburg County, North Carolina to George Duckworth. William Hunt was one of the purchasers at Simon Duckworth Estate Sale.

7. Sarah Duckworth b. 1794-1800. Married _____ Price. On 09 Jan 1827 Simon Duckworth bound himself to his daughter, Sarah Price, in the amount of \$1,000.00, obligation to grant and confirm to said Sarah Price a tract of land where she now lives, containing 50 acres in his lifetime or by will at his death. This tract was granted to Able Hankins Duckworth 07 Aug 1787 and sold to Simon Duckworth 16 May 1790.

8. George Duckworth b. c. 1794. On 02 Nov 1821 Simon Duckworth bound in sum of \$2,000.00 to George Duckworth, his son, to grant & convey to said George Duckworth 100 acres whereon said George Duckworth now lives at his death. George Duckworth on 18 April 1831 sold this tract to W.J. Wilson for the sum of \$150.87 which is due Margaret Wilson, guardian of the heirs of Robert Wilson from George Duckworth. Hopewell Church Cemetery, Margaret Wilson, wife of Robert Wilson, 1793-1876. What was the relationship between George Duckworth and Margaret Wilson? His sister? 14 Oct 1835 George Duckworth sold Ezekiel Alexander 100 acres.

Rebecca Duckworth, daughter of John and Sarah Hankins Duckworth. She was the wife of Nathan Mendenhall (1746-1835), a Revolutionary War soldier born in Chester County,

Pennsylvania. Before settling in Lincoln County, North Carolina in 1780, he lived in Philadelphia, Baltimore, and could have lived some time in Wilmington, Delaware, with relatives there. He came to York County (SC?) by 1773 and went north into Lincoln County in 1780. He had a brother in Stokes County, North Carolina. Their children were: Sarah, Ann, and Robert.

8th January 1810, William Duckworth and wife Margaret, of the State of North Carolina, County of Lincoln sell to Nathan Mendenhall of same for \$25.00 an eighth part of 160 acre tract of land, including the improvements of John Drake, deceased, in the State of North Carolina on the waters of Crowder's Creek. William and Margaret signed with their marks. Abel H. Duckworth, witness. Deed Book 25 p 379.

Chapter 3

WILLIAM and JANE UNKNOWN DUCKWORTH

Fragments of information indicate that William Duckworth was the eldest son of John and Sarah Hankins Duckworth of Burlington County, New Jersey and Frederick County, Virginia, where John died in 1757. William was probably born in the late 1730s. William Duckworth moved to McDowell's Creek, Mecklenburg County, North Carolina in the late 1760s, probably in company with his brothers John and Simon. John bought 110 acres on the head branches of McDowell's Creek from Henry McCulloch in 1767 (Mecklenburg County Deed Book 15, p. 83). No record of this William Duckworth buying or being granted land has been found.

In late 1770 or early 1771, William Duckworth died. His widow Jane and Joseph Moore were appointed administrators, and the final report of the estate was made to the January 1772 term of Court. The total amount of the sale was L 80 - 6 - 8 plus L 3 (an account collected) making a total of L 83 - 6 - 8. The estate owed L 25 - 16 leaving in the hands of the administrators L 57 - 10 - 8. A note on the back page states the Widow bought L 55 - 9 - 1. The estate owed John McDowell L 8, the largest single amount of debt, which may have been for rent. William was a farmer, as shown by the inventory of the sale, which included 21 head of black cattle, 4 head of horse creatures, 22 head of hogs, and 12 head of sheep. (John McDowell owned some seven or eight hundred acres of land on McDowell's Creek).

No further mention of the widow Jane has been found, and the names of all the children are not known. Land records in Burke and Mecklenburg Counties North Carolina indicate that the eldest son was John, and his pension application papers state that he was born 1759 in Virginia. Other sons were William, Jonathan, and George, who all moved to Burke County. The names of the daughters were Althea and Sallie.

LAND GRANT- To "John Duckwith (Heir at Law to William Duckwith) 200 acres. On the waters of McDowell's Creek joining McCulloh's & McGee's Land...30th January

1773 (File 1898) "for John Duckwith as heir at Law to William Duckwith Dec'd...Joseph Hobbs Jr. & Simon Duckworth, (chain bearers). John Duckworth of Burke County, North Carolina sold this 200 acres to John McKnitt Alexander 7th September 1795 (Mecklenburg County Deed Book 15, p. 161)

The children of William and Jane (Unknown) Duckworth were:

1. John Duckworth, Revolutionary Soldier, Burke County, North Carolina according to family tradition (letter 28 September 1955 from Miss Gertrude Neill, Morganton, North Carolina, a descendant of both John Duckworth and John Neill, in "The Duckworth Collection"): John Duckworth's father, I think his name was William, and John Neill came together from Virginia to North Carolina in the mid 1760s and were in all probability brothers-in-law, as her aunt said the sons of John Neill were first cousins of John Duckworth. He was born 1759 in Virginia and died November 6, 1843, in Burke County, North Carolina. He married Mary Robinson, and they were the parents of Mary married Abraham Keller, Althea married Simon Dorsey, Sarah married Thomas Morrison, William G. married (1) Catherine Keller (2) Rachel Hibbs, John R. married Sarah (Mary?) Sellers, Jonathan married Lucinda Fox, Alexander married Nancy Van Horn, and Thomas N. married (1) Jane F. Unknown (2) Mary Simmons. John Duckworth was wounded in the Battle at Ramseur's Mill and was at the Battle of King's Mountain.

2. Althea Duckworth. It is thought she married Sam Sherrill, Jr. and died in Blount County, Alabama.

3. William Duckworth was born 1765 and died 1848 in Burke County, North Carolina. The name of his wife has been lost. William lived on Hunting Creek, neighbor to Daniel England. He was a miller and served as a Burke County Commissioner. His children were: Jonathan married Martha "Patsy" Kincaid, Althea married David Porter, Jane married Martin Kibler, Sarah married Jesse P. Summers, Collins married Margaret Bell, Samuel married Mary Erwin, and David married (1) Sally Sides (2) Elizabeth Powell.

4. Sarah "Sallie" Duckworth was born 1765 in Mecklenburg County, North Carolina and died 7 February 1840 in Buncombe County, North Carolina. She is buried at Big Sandy Methodist Cemetery, Buncombe County, North Carolina. She married William Robeson and they were the parents of: John married Anna Palmer, Alexander married Mary Palmer, Mary married Thomas Foster, George D. married Elizabeth Palmer, Violet married Nathan Jones, Rebecca married David Mullins, Jane married Francis S. Gillespie, Elizabeth "Betsy" married David Duckett, and Isabella married William Peoples.

5. Jonathan and Kizziah England Duckworth will be discussed in the next chapter.

6. George Duckworth was born about 1771. He served in the War of 1812 and resided in Burke County, North Carolina. The names of his wife and one daughter have been lost. His daughter Agnes married Solomon Good in Burke County, North Carolina. He withdrew from Burke County to McMinn County Tennessee, where he died. His other

children were: John born 1796 and died 1841 in McMinn County, Tennessee. His wife was Ann Unknown, and she and family withdrew to Missouri. Thomas married Martha Sue Neill and withdrew to Stone County, Missouri. L.J. married Nancy Bracket. Hoppy married William A. Triplet.

Chapter 4

JONATHAN and KIZZIAH ENGLAND DUCKWORTH

Jonathan Duckworth was born about 1767 and died November 1807 in Burke County, North Carolina. Kizziah England was born about 1775 and died 16 January 1820 in Buncombe (part that is now Transylvania) County, North Carolina. She was the daughter of John and Jane Ann Grant England.

Kizziah Duckworth, the widow of Jonathan Duckworth, who died 10 November 1807 in Burke County, North Carolina of a disease that reached epidemic proportions, came to the Brevard, North Carolina area sometime before 1810 with seven children: four boys and three girls, "The Brevard Seven Duckworths." She was born ca. 1775 in North Carolina, place unknown, daughter of John England and married ca. 1795 in Burke County, North Carolina.

Her husband, Jonathan, was the son of William and Jane Duckworth of McDowell's Creek in Mecklenburg County, North Carolina and brother to John, William and George of Burke County and sisters Althea and Sarah. He was appointed by the October 1787 Term of the Burke Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions to serve on the road jury to lay off a road from Burke County and Morganton to Widow Hagan's. He was on the 1793 Tax List of Burke County, one poll, no land, and neighbor to William Duckworth, John and Daniel England (Hunting Creek). When Jonathan Duckworth died, he was living on the north side of the Catawba River and neighbor to Silas Murphy, John Bryant, and Mrs. Mary Bradley, all dying of the same disease in the course of four days.

There is no record of Jonathan or Kizziah owning land in Burke or Buncombe County North Carolina. At the time of the 1810 U.S. Census of Buncombe County, Kizziah was living near Ben Davidson, William Wilson Sr., Mary Shurk, Samuel King Jr., and George Osborn. It is believed Jonathan was living with his brother, William, in 1790, in Burke County, North Carolina.

The first organization of Baptist, in what is now Transylvania County, North Carolina, was an arm of the French Broad Baptist Church, started 17 April 1813 and organized 22 July 1822, as Cathey's Creek Baptist Church. Kizziah Duckworth joined the mission prior to the permanent organization. She died 16 January 1820 and was the first recorded death of the membership and the first buried in the cemetery.

She was the first Baptist of record in the Duckworth family, and her influence must have been great, as all four of her sons were active in the church, and she had two grandsons

who became Baptist preachers of some note.

Jonathan and Kizziah Duckworth were the parents of "The Brevard Seven Duckworths":

1. John McCamie was born 7 June 1797, died 2 March 1887, married Sarah Hamlin, daughter of Elikiam and Ann Reagan Hamlin, and lived at Cathey's Creek.
2. Jane was born ca. 1799, died about 1869, and married William Harrison Nicholson, son of John Nicholson. They lived at Cherryfield and Dunn's Rock.
3. David was born in 1801, died in February 1891, married Mary Williamson, daughter of Charles Williamson, and moved from the North Fork of the French Broad River to Union County, Georgia between 1834 and 1836. He will be discussed in next chapter.
4. Jonathan, twin to David, died ca. 1870, married Rebecca Hunter, and moved from Cherryfield to Union County, Georgia after 1843.
5. William was born 26 April 1805, died 2 July 1884, married Sarah A. Jordan, daughter of Joseph and Hannah Davis Jordan. Lived and died at Cherryfield.
6. Elizabeth was born 5 August 1807, died 1 February 1854, and married John Hamlin, son of Elikiam and Ann Reagan Hamlin. They lived at Cherryfield and Brevard.
7. Charlotte, whose dates of birth and death have been lost, may have been twin to Elizabeth. She married Thomas Aiken, son of Ezekiel and Sarah McCravey Aiken. They lived at Cherryfield.

The Duckworth family were members of the Presbyterian Church before the marriage of Jonathan to Kizziah England.

Why did Kizziah remove from Burke to Buncombe County after the death of Jonathan? She had no relatives living in Buncombe County. It must have been to keep her family together. Had she remained in Burke County, the County Court would have put her children out for adoption. The part of Buncombe County to which she moved was a wild and recently settled area. The possibility of family interference here was small and they felt safe here.

Chapter 5

DAVID and MARY WILLIAMSON DUCKWORTH

David Duckworth was born in 1801 in Burke County, North Carolina and died in 1891 in Union County, Georgia. Mary Williamson was born 1805 in Buncombe County, North Carolina and died in 1885 in Union County, Georgia. They married in 1820 in Buncombe

County, North Carolina and removed to Union County, Georgia about 1833. They joined The Baptist Church of Christ at Choestoe 10 September 1836. David was elected Deacon 11 September 1841. He was elected or appointed to represent the Church at Association and Union Church meetings many times.

David came to Union County, Georgia hunting pasture land on which to raise horses. His horse bell is in the possession of his descendants. On an early visit to the area, he observed the luxuriant growth of grass in the Jack's Gap area and stated, "This is the place I am looking for." The Indians kept the undergrowth burned off and the grass grew abundantly. David bought two land lots, 120 acres, in Choestoe, joining the Arkaquah District line. A part of this land remained in the Duckworth Family until just before the death of Clyde Duckworth, son of Archibald, but in later years William Henry Duckworth, Jr. bought a tract of the land and reconstructed a log house near the homesite of General Jackson Duckworth's old home.

One time during court week in Blairsville, David had a young horse he was trying to sell. The horse was fat and slick. David stated that he fed him one ear of corn at a feed and he wanted \$50.00 for the colt. Someone offered him \$50.00 for the animal if he would shoe it. This David refused to do and he got \$50.00 for the horse. The new owner asked if one ear of corn was all he fed the horse at a feed, to which David replied, "But I feed him four times a day."

John Souther cut a road across David Duckworth's field without permission and they had a fight. On 13 November 1847, the church in conference took up the case of Brother John Souther and excluded him for same. The church took up the case against Brother David Duckworth and acquitted him. On October 13, 1849, the church took up the report of the committee in regard to the difficulty existing between Brethren Duckworth and John Souther, Joseph Souther, and his wife, which the acknowledgement by each one and the Church recorded the acknowledgement and they were all returned to their former status. They also agreed that the report of the committee be entered on the minutes of the Church Book.

David and Mary Duckworth had twelve children to reach maturity, the first five being born in North Carolina. Their children were as follows:

1. John Williamson Duckworth, b.1821, d. 5 July 1913. Married 31 December 1846, Susannah Jackson, daughter of William and Nancy Owenby Stanley. They will be further discussed in the next chapter.
2. Nancy Duckworth, born after 1850. Married William Bryant, probable son of John and Mary Bryant. It is not known when or where William and Nancy died. In 1860 they were living in Union County, Georgia and had the following children: David, James M., Mary F., Louisa E., and Susan.
3. Mary Elizabeth Duckworth, b. 1827, d. unknown. Married 4 January 1863 James Nix, son of William and Susannah Stonecypher Nix. James and Mary E. Nix had (1) Mary

Evaline m. William Merida Davis, (2) Nancy died young, (3) Buddy died young, and (4) Sophronia Jane m. 1. Isaac Wilson, m. 2. Enoch C. Hood.

4. Rebecca Evaline Duckworth, b. 14 May 1828, d. 14 June 1914. Married 1 January 1872 James Nix, son of William and Susannah Stonecypher Nix. James and Rebecca had one child that died in infancy.

5. Jonathan Marion Duckworth, b. 9 May 1831, d. 15 July 1908 Rye, Colorado. Married 24 January 1858 Mary Ellen Hunter, daughter of William Jonathan Johnson and Margaret Elizabeth England Hunter.

6. Mary Ann Duckworth b. 1835. Married 17 December 1865, James N. "Jim Jesse" Collins, son of Archibald and Mary Nix Collins. Their children were (1) William "Bill Posey" m. 1. Margaret Dyer, m. 2. Lee Eliza Coffee; (2) John T. m. Louise Presley; (3) Archibald; (4) Emma m. Joseph Ben Dyer; (5) Louise m. J.M. Presley.

7. Charlotte Caroline Duckworth, b. 1837. Married c. 1873-4 James Andrew Hunter, son of William Jonathan Johnson and Margaret Elizabeth England Hunter. Their children were (1) James V., (2) Mary M., and (3) Jason F.

8. Louisa Matilda Duckworth, b. 1839. Married 2 December 1866 James Andrew Hunter, son of William Jonathan Johnson and Margaret Elizabeth England Hunter. James and Matilda had one son, William m. b. 1867 and Matilda died ca. 1868-70.

9. Washington Duckworth, b. 1841. Married 1 February 1858 Louise Curtis. He appears to have died by the time of the 1860 Census of Union County. Louise was living with her parents with a 1 year old daughter named Rebecca. No further information.

10. Harriet Caroline Duckworth, b.26-28 December 1842, d. 27 April 1911. Married 2 April 1865 Jasper Nix, son of James and Elizabeth Collins Nix. Their children were (1) Mary Ann, m. William D. Shuler; (2) John Washington, m. 1. Mary Dover, 2. Cathryn Dyer, m. 3. Maggie Rice; (3) Ben, m. 1. Laura Duckworth, 2. Georgia Ann Duckworth; 3. Minerva Ann Owens; (4) James Thomas "Jim Check," m. Mary Ruth Hunter; (5) William David, m. 1. Dora Alexander, 2. Georgia Savannah (Joyce) Jones; (6) Martha, m. Joe Frady; (7) Albert Marion, m. Mary Aveline West; (8) Emma, m. Archibald Duckworth; (9) Alonzo "Lon," m. 1. Margaret Harkins, 2. Georgia Savannah (Joyce) (Jones) Nix; (10) Frank McDonald, m. Celia West; (11) Joseph, m. 1. Sarah Emaline Dover Sellers, 2. 11. Sophronia Jane Duckworth, b. 1845. Married 25 October 1868 John Pruett Collins, son of Archibald and Mary Nix Collins. John and Sophronia Jane's children were (1) Mary Jane, m. Thomas Kimsey Jackson; (2) Olive Leathie, m. James Sullivan; (3) Anna, m. 1. Dave Turner, 2. Tom Elliott; (4) Margaret, m. John Francis Collins; (5) Jasper M., m. Catherine "Kit" Graham; (6) Ollie, m. James S. Nix; (7) Verdie, m. Milton R. Jayne.

12. William G. Duckworth, b.1848-9. Married 28 August 1871 Celia Nix, daughter of

James and Elizabeth Collins Nix.

David sold the Choestoe land to his son John W. and grandson General Jackson, and bought a farm on Arkaquah Creek below his brother Jonathan. He resided here several years before he and Mary separated.

Chapter 6

JOHN WILLIAMSON and SUSANNAH JACKSON DUCKWORTH

John Williamson Duckworth, "Big Grand Pa," was born in 1821 in Buncombe (now Transylvania) County, North Carolina and died July 5, 1913, Choestoe, Union County, Georgia. Susannah Jackson was born July 27, 1826, in Rutherford County, North Carolina and died October 26, 1889 Choestoe, Union County, Georgia. They were married December 31, 1846 in Union County, Georgia. They were the parents of

1. General Jackson Duckworth, who will be discussed in the next chapter;
2. Francis Marion Duckworth, who married Nancy Ellen Davis;
3. Sophronia Jane Duckworth, who married Thomas F. "Tom Thasher" Collins;
4. Mary S. Duckworth, who married Andrew Crocket Townsend;
5. William Washington Duckworth, who married Rebecca Elizabeth Wilson;
6. Nancy Ann, spinster.
7. David Lafayette Duckworth, who married Mary Elizabeth Gurley, Nancy Saxton, and Martha Teague;

9. Georgia Ann Duckworth, who married Benjamin Newton "Ben" Nix;
10. Sarah E. Duckworth, who married Benjamin N. Dyer;

J.W. Duckworth was sworn in by Colonel T. J. Haralson to serve as a Sergeant in Capt.

Young's Company of the Allegheny Troopers of the Confederate Army within the limits of the state of Georgia for six months August 1, 1863, at Blairsville, Georgia. He used his own horse and equipment in the army, which were valued by the army as follows: horse, \$300; horse equipment, \$50.00. J. W. Duckworth was sworn in by Captain W.L. Hubbard as a Private in C Co., 30th Battalion, 11th Georgia Cavalry to serve in Northeast Georgia May 2, 1864, at Mossy Creek, Georgia. His name appears on a receipt roll for clothing, dated September 30, 1864.

John W. Duckworth appeared on the roll of Allegheny Lodge No. 114 for the first time in 1868. No entry is made of a suspension, but in 1874 we find his reinstatement as of January 10, 1874. He appeared on the roll from that time until his death is recorded, August 10, 1913. Georgia Grand Lodge, Sec. Jan. 6, 1955.

John W. was issued a License to Peddle for his services in the Confederate Army. He placed two small round brass bells on the hames of his mule's collars to let the people know he was on the way. One of these bells is in the possession of a descendant.

John W. and his great grandson, Frank Calloway Duckworth, walked to the Law Ground to vote one Election Day. John W. said to Frank, "This will probably be the last time I will vote and the first time of voting for you. Don't you do what I have done, and I am ashamed of it. And that is vote for a xxx Republican."

Chapter 7

GENERAL JACKSON and CELIA EMILINE COLLINS DUCKWORTH

General Jackson Duckworth was born 15 September 1847, married 25 October 1866 Celia Emiline Collins, daughter of Archibald and Mary Nix Collins, born 7 October 1845, died 27 March 1918. Both were born, lived, and died in Union County, Georgia. Both are buried in Old Liberty Baptist Church Cemetery.

1. Mary Ann, born 26 January 1868, married W. Tom Harkins, 1 October 1884. Died 14 April 1962.
2. John Francis "Jack" Duckworth and Laura Jane Noblet will be discussed in the next chapter.
3. Susie Jane, born 30 April 1871 and died 3 September 1913. She married James Lon Turner and resided in Arkaquah District of Union County, Georgia. Both are buried in Old Liberty Baptist Church Cemetery.
4. Archibald Calloway, born 8 February 1873 and died 9 January 1957. He was married

three times: Emma Nix, Holley Etter Collins, and Sarah Malissie Clark. They all lived and died in Union County, Georgia and are buried in Old Liberty Baptist Church Cemetery.

5. Nancy Elizabeth, born 14 October 1874 and died 10 September 1966 in Chattanooga, Tennessee. She married John Claude Wood.

6. Margaret S., born 2 April 1877 and died 13 November 1918. She married James Harkins.

7. William Marion was born 7 February 1879 and died 4 November 1921. He married Mary Jane Harkins.

8. Carey Donna was born 4 April 1880, and married Johnny Nicholson.

9. Charley Gouden was born 16 April 1882 and died 10 February 1969. He married Eller Smathers. No issue.

10. Martha Ellen was born 2 May 1884, and married Jerry L. Nix.

11. Naomey C. was born 16 May 1886 and died 9 June 1986.

General Jackson Duckworth was a farmer and a blacksmith. His farm was a part of the original David Duckworth land and lay joining the Arkaquah-Choestoe District line. He made or built two farm wagons each year. He had "funny" ideas about many subjects and was "set in his way." He was in the Home Guard in the Civil War. He ran the first Agricultural Agent off his farm and told him not to come back. At time of an election, Francis Marion and Frank C. Duckworth would let the word out that they were voting for the man opposite their candidate to keep General J. from voting for the opposition. General J. did not want anyone to think that Francis M. and Frank C. were "handling" him. General J. did not believe in education and said if a child was going to be a criminal that he would be a bigger criminal if he had an education and it was best for him not to know anything.

Chapter 8

JOHN FRANCIS "JACK" and LAURA JANE NOBLET DUCKWORTH

John Francis "Jack" Duckworth had little or no education and could write his name only a short time before his death. He was strong in his belief of going to school. He made the remark, "If I had the education of Tom Jackson, I would turn Union County upside down." He urged his children to go to school and supported all educational programs.

John Francis Duckworth was a farmer, mail carrier, and horse trader. The latter was his

life and joy, and it is said that he had planned to move to Gainesville and open a livery stable. He told his boys to always tell the truth in a horse trade and never tell anything that could be seen in the animal unless asked. Then tell the truth. He may want to trade again in the future.

Two short stories of his horse trading follow. John Duckworth always kept a cow. His cow went dry and there was no milk for the children. While on his mail route, he observed a fresh cow at the Cook farm and traded cows in a short time. The cow he traded was a young cow and calved a short time after the trade. The cow he traded for was an old cow. Mr. Cook laughed about beating "Jack" Duckworth in a cow trade. He may be a good horse trader, but he sure can't trade cows. Shortly after this, "Jack" was carrying the mail and riding a three-year-old filly. He stopped at the Cook residence and told Mrs. Cook to look at the young mare he had traded for Laura to drive to Sunday School. Mrs. Cook was impressed with the young mare and called Mr. Cook to come look at her. He came and began talking trade immediately, but "Jack" repeated his plans for Laura to drive the mare to church. However, Mr. Cook insisted they trade, which they did eventually. In a few weeks, Mr. Cook came for a trade back; the mare was a "stump sucker". "Jack" told Mr. Cook that he was no cow trader but the best horse trader in Union County and he would not trade back. This ended the matter.

One more horse trade: John Duckworth traded for a poor old blind mare from one of the Spivey's on Upper Choestoe. He took the mare home, fed her, and doctored the eyes. Come spring the horse had gained weight and the eyes were well. A Mr. Reece came by and bought the horse and took her home. A short time afterward, Mr. Reece met his nephew, Zack Jackson, who inquired where he was going. Mr. Reece replied "to Blairsville to hire Pat Harrison to sue Jack Duckworth for lying about the old Spivey mare." Zack Jackson told his uncle he couldn't do that because Jack Duckworth had a license to tell lies. Mr. Reece replied, "The heck you say!" and returned home.

Laura Jane Noblet was the illegitimate daughter of Elsie Noblet. She had an older full sister, Tine, who married a Mr. Bagwell and resided in Dalton, Georgia. Laura also had two half brothers, Claude Wood, who married Elizabeth Duckworth, and William Nicholson. Laura came to live with Francis Marion and Nancy Davis Duckworth when a small girl. She attended two or three short school terms but could read, write, and figure. It is said "Jack" would ask her to figure the interest on a note due him, which she did in her head, and gave the correct answer.

John Francis "Jack" Duckworth and Laura Jane Noblet were the parents of the following children:

4. Nellie Jane Duckworth, 29 December 1896 - 6 February 1868. Married John A. Wimpey, a merchant. Four children: Charley, Ethel, Ruby, and Charlene.

Chapter 9

FRANK CALLOWAY and SARAH CHRISTINE DUCKWORTH

Frank C. Duckworth was born 23 December 1890 and died 10 March 1973 in Greene County, Tennessee. Sarah Christine Jackson was born 7 January 1892 and died 16 November 1972 in Greene County, Tennessee. She was the daughter of Thomas Kimsey and Mary Caroline Collins Jackson. Frank C. was first a farmer and later a merchant. He made his first crop with a Jersey yoke of steers and his first horse was a "stump sucking" mare and a tar grinder wagon. He was a good judge of livestock, quick to make decisions, and quick to trade. He drove a wagon team to Gainesville, Georgia with produce and hauled merchandise back over the mountain when not in his crop. He also hauled cross ties to the railroad at Murphy, North Carolina. He first clerked for his brother-in-law, Robert Jackson. Later he entered business with his brother-in-law, John A. Wimpey, at Blairsville, Georgia. About 1930-31, he sold his interest to John A. Wimpey and moved to Hiawassee, Georgia, where he opened a general merchandise store. He retired from the store and lived in Hiawassee until he moved to Greeneville, Tennessee.

Frank Duckworth was a Baptist, a Mason, and a Democrat. He was a deacon in McConnell Baptist Church, Hiawassee, Georgia. He was a trustee of Young Harris College for 20 years. He was a Democrat serving on the honorary staff of former Georgia governors M. E. Thompson and Carl Sanders. He was a personal friend of former Georgia governors E. D. Rivers and Ellis Arnold and Congressman Phil Landrum of the Ninth Congressional District of Georgia.

Frank Duckworth was able to talk to the Governor of Georgia or a small tenant farmer in Towns or Union County, Georgia. He could adjust or fit in any crowd. He loved people

and showed this love by his actions and daily living. He loved his relatives, rich or poor, but they had to be honest.

He loved my mother with all his might and described this best when he said, "She will work on either side of the tongue she is hitched." They married when quite young, worked and saved all the time. They were the perfect team.

My daddy and I never had the first misunderstanding. We never argued or fussed about any thing. What was the need? He was always right and knew the right and proper thing to do. He was the best friend I ever had.

Frank and Christine Duckworth had two children: Ancel Lee and John Francis "Jack". Both sons were veterinarians. Ancel L. married Sarah Corn and had one son, Ancel Lee Duckworth, Jr. John F. married Delia Swain and had three children: Jackie, Judy, and Frank. John and Delia were divorced and John married Jewel Neal.

This completes the story of My Family. It has been an interesting journey and covers many years. The research and study of the family has reached many areas and involved the study of church, local, and national history. I wish to say this has been a study of love, not only of my father and mother, but love for all my ancestors and relatives.

APPENDIX A

The Ancient History of the Distinguished Surname DUCKWORTH

Following is a history of the English name "Duckworth" which was published by The Hall of Names Ltd., 205 St. John's Hill, Battersea, London SW1 1TH, England

The Saxon Chronicle, compiled by monks in the 10th century, now reposes in the British Museum. It is a history of the Saxon settlement of England.

History researchers have examined reproductions of such ancient manuscripts as the Domesday Book (1086), the Ragman Rolls (1291-1296), the Curia Regis Rolls, The Pipe Rolls, the Hearth Rolls, parish registers, baptismal, tax records. They found the first record of the name Duckworth in Cambridgeshire where they had been seated from early times.

Throughout the centuries your name, Duckworth, occurred in many records, manuscripts and documents but not always with your exact spelling. From time to time the surname was spelt Duckworth, Dykeward, Duckword, Duckward, Duckwort, Duckwart, Dickworth, Dickward, Dickword, Dickwort, and these variations in spelling frequently occurred, even between father and son. Scribes and church officials frequently spelled the names phonetically. As a result the same person would be recorded differently on birth, baptismal, marriage, and death certificates.

The Saxon race gave names to many English surnames, not the least of which was the surname Duckworth. The Saxons, invited into England by the ancient Britons of the 4th century, were a fair skinned people their home was the Rhine Valley. They were led by two brothers, General\Commanders Hengist and Horsa, The Saxons settled in the county of Kent, in southern England. During the next four hundred years they forced the Ancient Britons back into Wales and Cornwall in the west and Cumberland to the north. The Angles occupied the eastern coast, the south folk in Suffolk, and the north folk in Norfolk. Under Saxon rule England prospered under a series of High Kings, the last of which was Harold.

In 1066, there was the Norman invasion from France and their victory at the Battle of Hastings. In 1070, Duke William took an army of 40,000 north and wasted the northern counties, forcing many rebellious Norman nobles and Saxons to flee over the border into Scotland. The Saxons who remained in the south were not treated well under hostile Norman rule, and many also moved northward.

Nevertheless, this notable family name, Duckworth, emerged as an influential name in the county of Cambridge. The surname Duckworth comes from the occupation "dykeward," who was a man appointed on the east coast to watch the embankments. In pre-Henry VIII times the name was spelled Dykeward and over the years changed to the contemporary name Duckworth. From the eastern counties of England, the name traveled to the southwest counties to Topsam in Devonshire and Somerset. It also traveled to the northern county of Lancashire, where in 1310 Henry Duckworth held the estate of Oswaldtwistle and Duckworth, in the parish of Whalley. By 1379 Henricus Duckworth had inherited the family estates, continuing a tradition of a long line of Duckworths in this northern community. In the south the Baronet of Topsham had established estates and manors in Devonshire.

In Barwen in Somerset, another branch acquired estates. In nearby Hampshire, the Duckworths were included in a census of large landowners in the middle ages. Sometime later the family moved to London and followed business pursuits. At this same time Lancashire Duckworths moved into the commercial center at that time, the city of Manchester. Those Duckworths who stayed in England continued to flourish, especially in the south. Notable amongst the family at this time was Duckworth at Cambridgeshire.

During the 15th, 16th, 17th, and 18th centuries England was ravaged by plagues, famine, and religious conflict. Protestantism, the newly found political fervor of Cromwellianism and democratic government, and the remnants of the Roman Church rejected all non believers. The changing rule caused burnings, hangings and banishments of all sects and creeds. Many families were freely "encouraged" to migrate to Ireland, or to the "colonies." Some were rewarded with grants of lands, others were banished.

The families who migrated to Ireland became known as the Adventurers for land in Ireland. Protestant settlers "undertook" to keep their faith, being granted lands previously owned by the Catholic Irish. There is no record of this distinguished family migrating to Ireland, but this does not preclude the possibility of individual migration.

The New World offered better opportunities and some migrated voluntarily. Some left Ireland, disillusioned with promises unfulfilled, but many left directly from their home territories. Some also moved to the European continent.

Members of the family name Duckworth sailed aboard the huge armada of three-masted sailing ships known as the "White Sails" which plied the stormy Atlantic. These overcrowded ships such as the Hector, the Dove and the Rambler, were pestilence ridden, sometimes 30% to 40% of the passenger list never reaching their destination.

During the course of our research we also determined the many Coats Of Arms granted to different branches of the family name.

The most ancient grant of a Coat of Arms found was: On a silver background, a black cross with a gold cross surmounted, and at the top two dragon's heads, surrounded by four arrow heads.

The Crest was: A dragon's head surrounded by four arrow heads.

Another account of the history of the Duckworth name follows. This is copied from a paper furnished to me by Margaret Duckworth Sewell.

THE NAME and FAMILY of DUCKWORTH

The name of DUCKWORTH is derived from the residence of its first bearers at Duckworth, an estate at Oswaldtwistle, in the Parish of Whalley. Lancashire, England. The literal meaning of the name is "Docca's Estate," Docca being an ancient Anglo-

Saxon personal name of uncertain origin. In ancient English and early American records the name appears in the various spellings of Ducworth, Dukeworth, Dokeworth, Dokworth, Duckeworth, Duckworth, and others.

Later branches of the family removed from Lancashire into the British counties of York, Surrey, and London. These lines in some cases were of lesser gentry of Great Britain.

The earliest definite records of the name in England are those of Henricus or Henry of (de) Dukeworth, who was living in Yorkshire about the year 1379, and of Johannes or John Dukeworth, who was living in Yorkshire at about the same time, or soon thereafter.

Although there is considerable evidence to the effect that the Duckworths were established in the New World at an early period, the records of the emigration and of immigrant ancestors are not, for the most part, available. The first of the name of whom there is definite record in this country was Charles Duckworth, who served as a soldier in King Phillip's War in 1676, but there is no record of the immediate family or descendants of this immigrant to New England.

As early as the year 1684 one John Duckworth, probably the first of his line in America, was living in East Jersey. Later records of the family in New Jersey included those of William Duckworth, who witnessed the will of Thomas Fox, of New Hanover, Burlington County, N.J., in 1727. (The above copied from "The Name and Family of Duckworth" compiled by The Media Research Bureau, Washington, D.C. about 1940's)

A letter to the compiler of these notes dated 20 April 1951, from Ralph Duckworth, Naval Attache, British Embassy, Rio de Janeiro states in part: "My family came from Lancashire England. We have had the same land there since we got it from King Henry VIII in 1538 and my brother and I are the direct line of the family which has gone from father to son ever since the sixteenth century. The original name way back then was Dykewarden as they used to tend the dykes near the sea between Manchester and Liverpool. As far as I know all Duckworths came from this family, so I guess we must be cousins of some sort. Yours very sincerely,"

DUCKWORTH HALL

Duckworth Hall, one of the most historic of Oswaldtwistle's homesteads, with recorded evidence of about 800 years, carries us back to the Norman Lords of Oswaldtwistle. It has an added glamour of romance by reason of its association with one of the most noble orders of chivalry, which played a prominent part in the great crusades: the Knights Hospitallers.

Who, today, dream of association Duckworth Hall with romance of bygone ages? The buildings seem so utterly uninteresting and common-place, without special feature to mark its past greatness or ancient history.

So long as the adjoining hostelry bears its designation of "Duckworth Hall Inn" there is no danger of this famous historical site becoming lost to the people of Oswaldtwistle. We do miss a great deal of the pleasures of life by failing to read the lesson to be learnt from old places, the crumbling ruins, and even public house signs, familiar to our ken. It is only when these things are pointed out to us that familiar and commonplace scenes have surrendered some point of interest. So it is with Duckworth Hall, which carries us back, in imagination, to centuries long gone by.

Duckworth was once considered a separate vill, and its name denotes Saxon origin. It emerges from the mist of antiquity in the days of the Normans, when we find that Robert, son of Adam de Chedle, released to Richard de Radcliffe all his right in an oxgang of land in the vill of Duckworth. The Duckworth lands were in part the property of the Knights Hospitallers, and as we have just seen, in part, the property of the Lords of Oswaldtwistle, as the Radcliffes were.

The estate of Duckworth is named in the lot of the Hospitallers' lands as early as 1292. From that date to the sixteenth century, the Hospitallers' share of the land is often referred to. As to how they became possessed of Duckworth, we have to surmise. Perhaps some devout owner, filled with enthusiasm for the Crusades made a gift to this noble order, which combined religious fervor with benevolent work of relieving the sick and wounded. They were of the Order of St. John of Jerusalem and devoted to the aid of the sick, but added to this they became military monks. Throughout the Crusades they were very prominent, and played a part in all the hazardous enterprises of these adventures known in history as the Great Crusades. After the Crusades, the Order remained in existence until the sixteenth century when they had the Island of Malta given to them and continued there, until Napoleon in 1798. It is pleasing to know that the Order was revived in recent times on a firmer basis, and the modern institution in England of Knights of St. John..... (Copied from a paper furnished by Margaret Duckworth Sewell.).

APPENDIX B

JACKSON FAMILY

Nathan Jackson is the earliest Jackson known so far, found on the 1759 Tax List of Rowan County, North Carolina. The names of his wife and father are unknown. It is thought that Nathan might have been a brother to Samuel Jackson, who came to the area about the same time as Nathan. His father may have been John Jackson, who likewise came to the area about the same time. If Nathan was a brother to Samuel Jackson, he was an emigrant from Northern Ireland.

It is believed that Nathan Jackson had two and possibly three sons. The early Tax Lists of Rowan County, North Carolina name only Edward, but bits of evidence indicate the eldest son was John Jackson, born in Maryland. John came with his father to North Carolina when a young boy. He was a member of Sandy Creek Baptist Church and

served with American forces from North Carolina in the Revolution. John removed to Warren County, Georgia and had a son named Nathan. The other possible son was Joseph Jackson, who was younger than Edward.

Edward Jackson, son of Nathan, was born about 1755 and died about 1822 in Burke County, North Carolina. No record of Edward Jackson owning land in Rowan, Guilford, or Randolph County has been found. Neither has any record of his service in the Revolutionary War, participation in the Movement of Regulations, Tory activity, nor affiliation with the Quakers been located, although he was of the proper age, in the right location, and at the right time to have been involved in one of these. Edward Jackson was still in Randolph County on December 17, 1782, when he witnessed the deed of Josiah Lamb to Edward Beeson. The 1785 Tax List, Randolph County, North Carolina, Captain John Welborn's District, taken by Zebedee Wood, shows Edward Jackson 1 poll - no land; also, Joseph Jackson 1 poll - 100 acres on Deep River.

Edward Jackson came to southwest Burke County, North Carolina before 1790 and settled on a branch of Crooked Creek on the south side of the Catawba River. He was a neighbor to John Pittillo, Amos Chaffin, John Noblet, Robert Hodge, and Michael Souther, with whom his descendants intermarried.

On the 1793 Tax List of Burke County, North Carolina, Captain Adam's Company, there is listed Edward and John Jackson, no land, and one poll each.

At the April Term of the Burke County Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions, a Deed, dated September 13, 1792, for 185 acres of land, from Edward Vance to Edward Jackson was proved. And at the January 1798 Term of the Court, a deed dated March 1, 1797, 115 acres of land from John Gilliland to John Jackson was proved. By virtue of Warrant #3852, dated August 9, 1800, a survey for Edward Jackson for 30 acres lying on the south side of Byers Fork and bounded on the west by Robert Hodges, Sr. was made August 24, 1802. Millington Pittillo and Elijah Green were the chain carriers. The Burke Journal, Burke Genealogical Society, Vol. XII No. 3, August 1994, pp. 4-6.

“To the Worshipful Court in Morganton Sitting We the inhabitation of Burke County pray that a jury be appointed to establish the New Road leading through that part of our County formerly deeded to Rutherford, lately Restored to us; leading from the head of Crooked Creek to Cain Creek from the dividing Ridge at the head of Crooked Creek to our western Boundrey, the New Road has not been kept in order for want of proper authority, and for the purpose of Viewing and Making Return let the following be a Jury Viz: James Clark, Thomas Lytle, John Mann, Jacob Keller, Robert Hodge, Jesse Mendinghall, Millington Petillo, Esq. John Petillo, Edward Jackson, Benjamin Burgan, Joseph Ballew, William England, John England, William Davis, Thomas Davis, William Porter, Alexander Porter, William England Sr. And your petitioners will ever pray January 11th, 1810 Richard Bird, John Mann, H. Raburn, R. Fortune, Thomas Davis, Austin Heuishes/Hewins [?], John Abram, J.H. Stevilies, Richard England.”

The name of his wife is unknown but is thought to have been Susannah Chaffin. Edward

was the father of six sons and two daughters: John, Joseph, Elias, William Amos, Eli, Azeriah, Polly (Mary), and Peggy.

John Jackson was born about 1772, wife unknown and only two children known: William Marion, who married Nancy Elizabeth Owenby Stanley, and Susannah, who married Powel Owenby.

Joseph Jackson was born about 1774 and died 1843 in Union County, Georgia. He was the father of Jehale, born 1800-10; Margaret, married John Westmoreland; Anna, married Elijah Chaffin; Jane, married Leason Spivey; Susannah, married Joseph Chaffin; Sampson, married Susannah Crook; Jeremiah, married Jane Kettle; and Malinda, married Jessie Nix in Union County, Georgia.

Elias Jackson was born about 1776 and died before 1840. He married Edith Stanley and removed to Jackson County, Tennessee. Elias and Edith were the parents of Ephrium, born 1802 in North Carolina and died in 1864 in Burnet County, Texas. He married Edith Black. Joseph married Martha Johnson. Eliza married Nimrod Henley. Sarah married William Wood Hyde. Eli J. married Nancy Hannah Davidson. Edward S. Amos married Susannah Billingsley. Charles married Nancy Billingsley.

William Amos Jackson was born 1781 and died 1863 in Habersham County, Georgia. He married 1. Unknown Snider and had Hiram Henry who married (1) Margaret Fitzgerald, (2) Mary Whitaker; Sarah, married Unknown Fitzgerald; Polly; Edward, married Eleanor Smith. 2. Margaret Chaffin and were the parents of Joseph C., married Amelia Yearwood; Susannah, married David Jackson; Catherine, married William Gilbert; Rosetta; Elizabeth, married M. Owens.

Eli Jackson born about 1777 and died 1853 in Lumpkin County, Georgia. He married Tabitha Hodge in Burke County, North Carolina and their children were David, married Susannah Jackson; Amos, married Sophia Birdwell; Jane, married James Gaddis; John, married Sarah Elliot; Hodge; Andrew, married Mary M. Osborn; Zilla, married James A. Grizzle; Eli F.; and Armintha Corintha, married Thomas Lee.

Azeriah Jackson married Sarah Chaffin in Burke County North Carolina and removed to Jackson County, Tennessee. Their children were Edward, Sally, and Azariah Jasper "A.J." married Sally Ann Pippin.

Polly (Mary) Jackson married Moses Noblet and had William, Ann, and John Littleton, who married Rhoda Spivey, daughter of Leason and Jane Jackson Spivey. Their daughter, Elsie, was the mother of Laura Jane Noblet.

Peggy Jackson married Alexander Hopkins. They were the parents of Rebecca Adams, married John A. Brock, Jr.; Edward A., married Susan A. Champlin; John Isaac Creighton, married Amner Sexton; Alexander Jr., married Delina McClure; Elizabeth, married James Harvey Burk; and James T., married Sarah D. Noe.

John Jackson made a Deed to James Hase, 115 acres in Burke County, North Carolina, proved by Harris Gilliam.

On May 13, 1807, Stephen Morgan sold John Jackson of Burke County, North Carolina for \$300 150 acres in Rutherford County, North Carolina, west of Stone Mountain, on both sides of the Main Broad River, including the mouth of Rock Creek. Wts: Joseph Jackson and Samuel McCroyer. Recorded March 17, 1811, Book 24-26, p. 411. On April 19, 1808, John Jackson of Rutherford County, North Carolina sold this land to Harris Gilliam. Wits: Joshua Souther and Charles Gilliam. Recorded January 9, 1835, Book 41-42, p. 23.

No further land deed registration to or from John Jackson is to be found in the Rutherford County, North Carolina Land Records. However, there are a number of land entries and issues in The Rutherford County, North Carolina Entry Book. All these entries were in the area of Rock Creek, Main Broad River, and Sedar (Cedar) Creek. #1863 Feb 22, 1819. John Jackson enters 100 a. on Main Broad River, above the mouth of Rock Creek and near the foot of Stone Mountain. Issued. #2095 Jan. 7, 1820. John Jackson enters 50 a. on Main Broad River, including the Mouth of Rock Creek; includes his improvements where he now lives. Issued. #2096 Jan. 7, 1820. Arthur Owensby enters 50 a. on both sides of Rock Creek of Main Broad River. Border: John Jackson "above"; paid Issued. #2600 (second 2500) April 13, 1824, Powell Owensby enters 50 a. on both sides of Rock Creek of Broad River; border John Jackson. Issued. A Warrant No. 640 entered the 11th day of March 1830. Surveyed for Powell Owenby fifty acres of land in Rutherford County situated on Rock Creek. Including his improvements. Beginning at a poplar, Harris Gilliam's Corner, thence No 6 E 84 poles stake thence No 84 W 96 poles to a stake on the side of a mountain, thence No 6 W 84 poles to a stake on Gilliam's line thence to the beginning. The 17th of October 1830. F.A. Alexander & John Jackson, chainbearers. #2980 March 6, 1827 John Jackson enters 100 a. on Seder Creek. Border: John Cook's old line. Issued. #3075 Oct. 17, 1827 John Jackson enters 100 a. on headwaters of Seder Creek, between Stone Mountain and Round Mountain. Issued. #4098 Jan. 20, 1832 Amos Owensby enters 100 a. on head of Seder Creek. Border: above John Jackson's land. Issued. #4455 Jan. 1834 Samuel Elliott enters 50 a. on Cedar Creek. Border: joins his own land; including John Jackson's improvement of and entry he holds on said land. Issued.

Although John Jackson never recorded any further real estate after the sale to Harris Gilliam, he remained in the area of Rock Creek of Main Broad River, Stone Mountain, and Cedar Creek until he removed to Union County, Georgia about 1838. The Censuses of 1810, 1820, and 1830 confirm that he is one and the same John Jackson. He is listed among the members of The Baptist Church of Christ at Choestoe in 1843.

Powell Owenby died, and Susannah and family were in Union County, Georgia by 1850.

William Marion Jackson, 1795 - July 27, 1859, married Nancy Elizabeth Owenby Stanley, 1793 - 1861, December 23, 1814, in Rutherford County, North Carolina, daughter of Ambrose and Elizabeth Henson Owenby, granddaughter of John and Nanney

Porter Owenby, and sister to Robert N. Owenby. They removed from Rutherford County, North Carolina with his uncle, Joseph Jackson, to Habersham County, Georgia about 1826.

Girl (2) Armelia Jackson born August 3, 1820, and married _____ Neally. Moved to Tennessee and died at an old age. No nothing of this family.

Boy (3) Johile Jackson born June 9, 1822 and married Jane Duckworth daughter of Jonathan Duckworth. They lived and died at old age on Arkaquah Union County Georgia. Raised a large family 4 boys and 4 girls.

Girl (4) Suzy Jackson who was born about 1824. Married John W. Duckworth son of David twin brother to Jonathan Duckworth. They lived and died on Choestoe Union County Ga at an old age. Raised a large family 4 boys and 7 girls.

Boy (5) Kimsey Jackson was born about 1826. Married Sendy Thomas daughter of John Thomas. They lived on Choestoe Union County Ga. Kimsey Jackson got killed with wagon about year 1869. Sendy his wife died near Blairsville about year 1909. They raised 3 boys.

Girl (6) Mira Jackson was born about year 1827. She married Jehen Wimpey. The son of ---Wimpey. They lived and died on Choestoe Union County. Died at about 75 yrs. old. They were buried at Old Liberty Church. Raised 5 boys & 8 girls.

Boy (7) Marion Jackson my father was born May 9th 1829. He married Rebeccah Goforth who was born March 6th 1833. She was daughter of Miles Goforth. They married December 19th 1850. Rebecca died June 5th 1901 at an age of 68 yrs, 3 mos. 1

day. Marion was born in White County near the foot of Yonah Mountain 2 miles from Cleveland. Was moved to Choestoe Union County in 1831. Rebecca was born in Buncombe County N.C. was moved to Arkaquah Union County Ga while a girl (her people). They lived and died on Choestoe Union County, buried at Old Liberty Baptist Church of which church they were charter members and Deacon and Deaconess Officers of said church.

Teacher in public schools. Tax receiver of Union County 2 yrs. he is now selling goods on Arkaquah Union Co., Ga. Children by second husband: Rosey Collins, Parker, Watson are all at New Holland Cotton Factory near Gainesville Ga.

Boy (8) Thomas Kimsey Jackson (who is writer of this history) was born Dec. 17th 1867 and had a limited education. Was teacher for 17 yrs. in public schools and all except 1 yr. was teaching at his home school at Old Liberty. Merchandized farmed all connected. and was married to Mary Jane E. Collins b. 11/26/1869 (daughter of John P. & Fronia Collins) Dec. 13, 1885. Was married by Tompy Collins N.P. Her great uncle. Lived together for 1 yr 1 mo. & 4 days and she died from convulsions caused by giving birth. Never was conscious any more. dying on 17th Jan 1887. Was buried at the Little Cemetery near Old Liberty Baptist Church. She was a Christian woman. Consecrated

wife and was 17 yrs. 2 mo. & 21 days at her death. She had brother, Jasper M., 4 sisters Anner, Margaret, Olive, & Verdy. On January 13, 1889 I married again Miss Mary Caroline Collins who was 1st cousin to my first wife and daughter of Elijah Kimsey Collins whose father was Archy Collins & grandfather was Thompy Collins. Her father had 6 brothers James N., I. Car, John P., Thomas F., Marion & Issom A. 4 sisters Caroline (who married Jack Sutton), Emiline (who married General Duckworth), Ollie (who married James Nix of White Co), Lenda (who married Frank Wimpey). She (Mary Caroline) also has 2 brothers 1st. William Elisha (who married Sarah Turner) and now living on Arkaquah Union Co. 2nd. Emery Speer (who married Margaret Sullivan) and now living in Texas. and 4 sisters: (1) Sarah (who married George W. Thompson. Now living in Dalton Ga.) (2) Lida (who married Sam Garrett now living in Towns County Ga.), (3) Emily (who married Thomas Turner and are now living in Canton N.C.) (4) Cordia (who was only half sister who is not married living with father on Choestoe Union Co.Ga.

T.K. Jackson's 1st wife gave birth to 1 boy child whose name is Therman Silvester born Jan 15, 1887 was raised by his grandmother Jackson. Never knew what a mother was until he was going on 3 yrs old. He was taken away father and step-mother raising him. He joined Baptist Church (Old Liberty) in his teens, having lived a Christian obedient life so far. being one of the leaders of his church and Sunday School. Married 12/27/1900 at age 17 to Miss Lolia Souther (daughter of William A. & H----- Souther). They live on Choestoe farming & merchandizing. They have 4 children Emma, Donald, Worth, & Adell.

T.K. Jackson and his 2nd wife Mary C. had born to them 15 children 4 boys & 11 girls. Namely, Rosettia Iowa, Sarah Christine, Thomas Watson, Elmey, Martha Nevada, Fannie Jane, Ollie Mary, Lillie Bell, Mary Leona, Margaret Viola, Pat & Pearl (twins), Anna Maud, T.J. & Hugh Dorsey.

1st. Rosettie Iowa b. Dec. 5th 1889 joined Baptist Church at an early age Married B. Vasco Dyer Dec. 22, 1905 (son of Bud E. & Sarah Dyer). They are farmers living on Choestoe Union Co Ga. They have four children to wit: Ernest, Greely, Mary, Luneda, and Vance.

2nd. Sarah Christine was born Jan 7th 1892. Joined the Baptist Church at an early age. Married Frank C. Duckworth (son of John F. & Laura Duckworth) April 19th 1908. They are farmers now living on Arkaquah Union County Ga. They have born to them 2 boys Hoke who died in infancy and Ansel who is now 12 yrs. old.

3rd. Thomas Watson who was born Oct 21, 1893. Was an obedient quite and loving boy. Had entered school at Young Harris with expectation of gaining an education. Had the good will of faculty students and all who knew him. He took typhoid fever and died on the 19th day of January 1910 at 4 o'clock A.M. Was buried in Union Cemetery at Union Baptist Church near Young Harris Ga. He lived to be 16 yrs. 2 months 29 days old. And oh how we did miss him away but it was the Lord's will to take him away from us (The Lord giveth and the Lord taketh away. Blessed be the name of the Lord.)

4th. Elmev who was born August 1st 1895 and died in infancy Oct. 1st 1895. She lived 2 months was buried in Little Cemetery near Old Liberty Church Choestoe Union County Ga.

5th. Martha Nevada was born Aug 2nd. 1896. Joined the Baptist Church at an early age. Married Dec. 1915 Bob L. Jackson (son of William A. & Elizabeth Jackson). They now live in Young Harris Towns Co. Ga. (Merchandising). They have three girls Willie May, R.C., & Mozelle.

6th Fannie Jane who was born March 14th 1898 joined Union Baptist Church at an early age. Was freshman student at Young Harris College. Taught one public school at Gumlog. Married Earl Penland (son of Homer Penland) 1918. They have one child Lucile. They live 2 1/2 miles north of Young Harris. Farming & teamster.

NOBLET FFAMILY

The Noblets came from France.

Moses Noblet married Susannah ? Jackson, daughter of Edward Jackson, Granddaughter of Nathan Jackson. Moses and Susannah ? Jackson Noblet had a Son,. John Littleton Noblet, who married Rhoda Spivey, daughter of Leason and Jane Jackson Spivey. John L. and Rhoda Noblet had a daughter, Elsie Noblet, who was the Mother of Laura Jane Noble,
married John Francis "Jack:" Duckworth.

DUCKWORTH

I. John Duckworth born 1630 in England and died c1698 in St. Mary's MD.

One of the earliest records of a Duckworth in America was John Duckworth, under a four-year indenture, was one of 23 persons "imported into this province Registered in the Secretary's books of Records," 1 December 1684, upon the account of Wm Dockwra"

Jersey, first series, v.21, p. 61). William Dockwra (Dockray, Docwrae) was a London merchant and one of the proprietors of East Jersey.

John Duckworth was born in England. He had the following children: Joseph, Anna, John M., and William. The name of his wife is lost.

II. William 1665-1725\6 and Grace Duckworth

One William Duckworth was named on a muster roll of 1715 for the 5th Company (Capt. George Res Carrick) of Col. Thomas Farmar's N.J. Regiment (Annual Report of the State Historian [of New York], v. 1, p. 533, 1895).

William Duckworth was a witness to the will of Thomas Fox of New Hanover Township, Burlington Co., N.J., 25 Jan. 1727/28 (Ibid., v.23, p. 171)

The personal estate of William Duckworth, yeoman, of New Hanover, Burlington Co., N.J. was appraised at L 88 -, 9 - 6, 7 March 1727/28, by Asher Cleayton, John Wright, and Jonathan Fowler. On 15 March 1727/28 William Cook gave bond as administrator of the estate. His accounting of 22 March 1730/31 included charges for "sundrys furnished the widow in her last sickness, " two coffins, and digging two graves (Ibid., v. 23, p. 144).

In the May term 1728 the County Court confirmed William Bowgar and William Dean, who were appointed by Grace Duckworth, widow, during her last illness, as guardians for Joseph, Anna, and Mary Duckworth (Burlington Co., N.J., Minutes of Common Pleas, 1717-1733, p. 330). These three seem under 14; usually, orphans under age, but 14 or over, chose their own guardians.

III. John and Sarah Hankins Duckworth. Married in Burleyton County, NJ. Removed to Fredrick County VA where he was a Farner and died about 1756. Sarah born in 1702 died 1804. Sarah sold the farm, settled all business, and moved to Mecklenberg County, NC. The children were:

1. John, R.S., married 2 or 3 times in died in Mecklenberg County NC.
2. William and Jane of Mecklenberg County NC where he died about 1771.
3. Simon lived and died in Mecklenberg County, NC.
4. Sarah married John Neill, R.S., lived and died in Burke County, NC.
5. Rebecca married Nathan Mendenhal. R.S., lived and died in Lincoln County, NC. (Rebecca Duckworth) Mendenhall, born around 1748, died March 23, 1836, buried Olney Presbyterian Church Cemetery, Gastonia, NC.

IV. William and Jane Duckworth lived and died in Mecklenberg County, NC.

William Duckworth, son of John and Sarah Hankins Duckworth, was born c1735 and died c1771. He married Jane Unknown born c1758 and they were the parents of the following children: 1. John born 1759, of Burke County NC; 2. William of Burke County NC, 3. Jonathan of Burke County

NC; 4. George of Mecklenberg, Burke Counties NC and McMinn County TN, 5. Althea, and 6. Sarah of Buncombe County NC. No further record of Jane has been found after the settlement of the estate.

She either remarried or died about 1790.

LAND GRANT- To "John Duckwith (Heir at Law to William Duckwith) 200 acres. On the waters of McDowell's Creek joining McCulloh's & McGee's Land..30th January 1773 (File 1898) "for John Duckwith as heir at Law to William Duckwith Dec'd...Joseph Hobbs Jr. & Simon Duckworth. (chain bearers) John Duckworth of Burke Co., NC sold this 200 acres to John McKnitt Alexander 7th September 1795 (Mecklenberg Co. Deed Book 15, p. 161)

V. Jonathan and Keziah England Duckworth. Jonathan, was the son of William and Jane Duckworth of McDowell's Creek in Mecklenberg County, N.C. and brother to John and William of Burke County, and George who died in McMinn County, TN. Kezziah born c1771 was daughter of John England.

Little is known about his life except that found in the Burke Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions. October 1787 Term appointed to serve on the road jury to lay off a road from Burke County and Morganton to Widow Hagan's. He was on the 1793 Tax List of Burke County, one poll, no land, and neighbor to William Duckworth, John and Daniel England (Hunting Creek). January 1798 - Jonathan Duckworth - misdemeanor - Guilty - mis-trial by consent. April 1798 - bondsman for James Kidd, \$250, Constable. October 1798 William Duckworth, John Duckworth, and Jonathan Duckworth appointed jurors for Jan Session 1799. April Session 1799, Jonathan Duckworth, a delinquent Juror from last term, appeared and rendered sufficient excuse and thereby excused.

He was probably residing with his brother William Duckworth on Hunting Creek at the time of the 1790 Census of Burke County; he being the second male over 16 years of age, William's eldest son was not born until 1790. 1793 Tax List he was residing in Capt. Casion's Company as were Daniel England 89 acres, John England 0, Jonathan Duck 0, William Duckworth 0, John Duckworth 0, William Robinson 180 acres.

When Jonathan Duckworth died 10 November 1807 in Burke County, N.C. of a disease that reached epidemic proportions, he was living on the north side of the Catawba River neighbor to Silas Murphy, John Bryant, and Mrs. Mary Bradley, and all dying of the same disease in the course of four days.

Keziah, the widow of Jonathan Duckworth, came to the Brevard, N.C. area sometime before 1810 with seven children, four boys and three girls, "The Brevard Seven Duckworths". She was born ca. 1771 in N.C., daughter of John England, and married ca. 1795 in Burke County, N.C. There is no record of Jonathan or Keziah owning land in Buncombe County. At the time of the 1810 U.S. Census of Buncombe County, Keziah was living near Ben Davidson, William Wilson Sr., Mary Shurk, Samuel King Jr., and George Osborn.

The first organization of Baptist in what is now Transylvania County, N.C., was an arm of the French Broad Baptist Church, started 17 April 1813 and organized 22 July 1822. Keziah Duckworth joined the Mission prior to the permanent organization. She died 16 January 1820 and was the first recorded death of the membership and the first buried in the Cemetery. She was the first Baptist of record in the Duckworth Family

and her influence must have been great as all four of her sons were active in the Church and she had two grandsons who became Baptist Preachers of some note.

Jonathan and Keziah Duckworth were the parents of "The Brevard Seven Duckworths": 1. John McCamie was born 7 June 1797, died 2 March 1887, married Sarah Hamlin, daughter of Elikiam and Ann Reagan Hamlin, and lived at Cathey's Creek; 2. Jane was born ca. 1799, died about 1869, married William Harrison Nicholson, son of John Nicholson, and they lived at Cherryfield and Dunn's Rock; 3. David was born in 1801, died in February 1891, married Mary Williamson, daughter of Charles Williamson, and moved from the North Fork of the French Broad River between 1834 and 1836 to Union County Georgia; 4. Jonathan, twin to David, died ca.1870, married Rebecca Hunter and moved from Cherryfield to Union County, Georgia after 1843; 5. William was born 26 April 1805, died 2 July 1884, married Sarah A. Jordan, daughter of Joseph and Hannah Davis Jordan, lived and died at Cherryfield; 6. Elizabeth was born 5 August 1807, died 1 February 1854, married John Hamlin, son of Elikiam and Ann Reagan Hamlin, and they lived at Cherryfield and Brevard; and 7. Charlotte whose dates of birth and death have been lost but she may have been twin to Elizabeth, married Thomas Aiken, son of Ezekiel and Sarah McCravey Aiken, and they lived at Cherryfield.

VI. David and Mary Williamson. David Duckworth was born 1801 in Burke Co. N.C., the son of Jonathan and Kezziah Duckworth. The father died in Burke Co. 10 November 1807 of a disease that had reached epidemic proportions. The mother had moved to the French Broad River Area between Ben Davidson's Creek and Cathey's Creek by the time of the 1810 U.S. Census. Her neighbors were George Osborn, Samuel King Jr., Mary Shurk, Kizziah Duckworth, William Wilson Sr., and Benjamin Davidson. Keziah died 16 January 1820 and was the first member of The Cathey's Creek Baptist Church to die and was interned in the adjoining Cemetery.

About 1819 David married Mary Williamson, the daughter of Charles Williamson and wife whose name is unknown. Mary had two sisters and two brothers; the name of the eldest sister who married A. E. Sitton is unknown; the youngest sister, Nancy, married William Anthony; the eldest brother was John and the youngest brother was Charles Jr.

By 1820 David and Mary were living on the Main North Fork of The French Broad River, in what was then Macon Co. but now Transylvania Co., N.C. His brothers Jonathan and William and sisters Charlotte Akin, Elizabeth Hamlin, and Jane Nicholson lived at Cherryfield and brother John lived at Cathey's Creek in Buncombe Co. some few miles to the east.

Between 1830 and 1836 David Duckworth had moved his family and his wife's mother to Union Co., Georgia where he had purchased two land lots, 120 acres, in the Choestoe District on the Araquah District line.

He later sold the property on Choestoe to his son. John Williamson Duckworth, and purchased a farm on Araquah Creek east of Harmony Grove Baptist Church. His neighbors in 1870 were: John A. Christopher, Peter

Flowers, Maria Akens, William C. Hughes, Jonathan Duckworth, Southier Davis, John Teague, and John L. Logan.

David and Mary Duckworth were faithful members of The Baptist Church of Christ at Choestoe, from their becoming members 9 October 1836 by experience. On 9 September 1841 David was elected a Deacon and was ordained 12 March 1842. He was repeatedly appointed delegate or messenger from The Choestoe Church to the annual Baptist Association Meeting, in fact more often than any other member. During the twenty year period from 12 August 1840 to 8 September 1860 David was a delegate eighteen times.

In a book published some years ago about Choestoe and Choestoe people it is erroneously stated that David Duckworth was excluded from membership of the Choestoe Church for fighting. The Church Minutes, a microfilm copy of which are on deposit in Georgia Archives, Atlanta, Georgia, show that he indeed did have a fight with John Souther for cutting a road over David Duckworth's property and the matter was taken up in the Church Business Meetings several times and a special Presbytery was called to resolve the question. In the end David Duckworth was kept in membership but told he should have treated the matter differently.

The Church Minutes show that David Duckworth was excluded from membership 12 October 1867 for "hard sayings against Brother Pruett and Brother Curtis. On 6 November Elder William Pruett requested a letter of dismissal and in April 1869 Brother Curtis, Minister of the Gospel, requested a letter of dismissal. The Church Minutes show that Mary Duckworth died in 1885 and that David died in February 1891.

Frank C. Duckworth, great, great grandson of David Duckworth, said that David left N.C. searching for land suitable for forage on which to raise horses. David practiced good animal husbandry and was a renown horseman. It has been said that he always rode a good, fat horse, and the late Mrs. Sarah Souther Dyer said he always wore pretty boots. David Duckworth's horse bell, which he brought to Georgia from N.C., is still in the family.

Once at Circuit Court in Blairsville David had a young horse for sale and was asking \$50.00 for the colt which was fat and slick. A man asked how much he was feeding the colt, to which David answered, "two ears of corn at a feed". The man said "I will give you \$50.00 for the horse if you will put shoes on his feet"; to which David replied "I want \$50.00 for the horse and you can shoe him your self". Finally the man bought the horse, paid for him, and asked, "how much did you say you fed this horse?" To which David replied, "I feed him two ears of corn at a feed but I feed him four times a day".

David and Mary Duckworth had twelve children to reach maturity, the first five being born in NC. Their children were as follows:

1. John Williamson Duckworth b. 1821 d.5 July 1913 m. 31 December 1846, Susannah Jackson, daughter of William and Nancy Owenby Stanley.
2. Nancy Duckworth born after 1850 William Bryant, probable son of John and Mary Bryant. It is not know when or where William and Nancy died; in 1860 they were living in Union Co. Ga. and had the following

children: David, James M., Mary F., Louisa E., and Susan J. A Wm. Bryant, laborer, was in the household of Leason Spivey at the time of the 1850 Census.

3. Mary Elizabeth Duckworth b. 1827 d. unknown m. 4 January 1863 James Nix, son of William and Susannah Stonecypher Nix. James and Mary E. Nix had: 1. Mary Evaline m. Wm. Merida Davis, 2. Nancy died young, 3. Buddy died young, and 4. Sophronia Jane m(1) Isaac Wilson m. (2) Enoch C. Hood.

4. Rebecca Evaline Duckworth b. 14 May 1828 d. 14 June 1914 m. 1 January 1872 James Nix, son of William and Sussanah Stonecypher Nix. James and Rebecca had one child that died in infancy.

5. Jonathan Marion Duckworth b. 9 May 1831 d. 15 July 1908 Rye, Col. m. 24 January 1858 Mary Ellen Hunter.

6. Mary Ann Duckworth b. 1835 m. 17 December 1865, James N. "Jim Jesse" Collins, son of Archebald and Mary Nix Collins. Their children were: 1. William "Bill Posey" m. (1) Margaret Dyer m. (2) Lee Eliza Coffee, 2. John T. m. Louise Presley, 3. Archebald, 4. Emma m. Joseph Ben Dyer, 5. Louise m. J.M. Presley.

7. Charlotte Caroline Duckworth b. 1837 m.c.1873-4 James Andrew Hunter, son of William Jonathan Johnson and Margaret Elizabeth England Hunter. Their children were 1. James V., 2. Mary M., and 3. Jason F.

8. Louisa Matilda Duckworth b. 1839 m. 2 December 1866 James Andrew Hunter, son of William Jonathan Johnson and Margaret Elizabeth England Hunter. James and Matilda had one son, William m. b. 1867 and Matilda died ca. 1868-70.

9. Washington Duckworth b. 1841 m. 1 February 1858 Louise Curtis. No further record of this family has been found.

10. Harriet Caroline Duckworth b. 26-28 December 1842 d. 27 April 1911 m. 2 April 1865 Jasper Nix, son of James and Elizabeth Collins Nix. Their children were: 1. Mary Ann m. William D. Shuler, 2. John Washington m. (1). Mary Dover, (2) Cathryn Dyer, (3) Maggie Rice, 3. Ben m. (1) Laura Duckworth, (2) Georgia Ann Duckworth, (3) Minerva Ann Owens, 4. James Thomas "Jim Check" m. Olive Leathie m. James Sullivan, 3 Anna m. (1) Dave Turner (2) Tom Elliott, 4. Margaret m. John Francis Collins, 5. Jasper M. m. Catherine "Kit" Graham, 6. Ollie m. James S. Nix, 7. Verdie m. Milton R. Jayne.

12. William G. Duckworth b. 1848-9 m. 28 August 1871 Celia Nix, daughter of James and Elizabeth Collins Nix.

It is not known for certain where David and Mary Duckworth are buried but in view of the fact that they attended Choestoe Church after they moved to Araquah it is most probably they are buried in the Old Choestoe Cemetery.

VII. John Williamson and Susannah Jackson Duckworth. John "Big Grand Paw" He was born 1821 in Buncombe County, (what is now Transylvania) NC, the eldest child of David and Mary Williamson Duckworth. He removed

with his parents to Union County, GA in 1836 and settled in Lower Choestoe District where David had bought 120 acres of land. John died here in 1913 and is burried in the Old Choestoe Cemetery beside his wife, Susannah Jackson, daughter of William and Nancy (Owenby) Stanley Jackson.

John served in the Confederate Calvary.Young's Company, GA Cavalry (Allegany Troopers), 11th Regiment, GA Cavalry

John W. Duckworth, Co.C, 11th GA Cav. Reg. for 1 yr., out in May 1865 in SC. An affidavit follows: "I was home sick furlough from Hospital in Augusta. about the first of March and again about middle of March 1865, by order of Col. Andrew Young. I was still sick at surrender. I was born in Buncombe County, NC in 1821 and have lived in GA since 1834. Signed 1904, John W. Duckworth.

Homeguard for Union County, 1861 - 1865 - A.B. Cook, John Duckworth, zaabry Sullivan, J. Marion Duckworth, James Cook.

John was ussued a Locense to Peddle in Union County GA and had small brass bells on fis mules to announce he was coming. (I have one of these bells.)

He was a Farmer and had several books of History which he read and found names for his boys. Their children were:

VIII. General Jackson and Emiline Collins. His farm was a part of the original David Duckworth land and lay joining the Arkaquah-Choestoe District line. He made or built two farm wagons each year. He had "funny" ideas about many subjects and was "set in his way." He was in the Home Guard in the Civil War. He ran the first Agricultural Agent off his farm and told him not to come back. At time of an election, Francis Marion and Frank C. Duckworth would let the word out that they were voting for the man opposite their candidate to keep General J. from voting for the opposition. General J. did not want anyone to think that Francis M. and Frank C. were "handling" him. General J. did not believe in education and said if a child was going to be a criminal that he would be a bigger criminal if he had an education and it was best for him not to know anything.

Confederate pension file:

01. General Jackson Duckworth died 3:00 p.m. 14 August 1935, insufficiency of the mitral valve.
02. He served in Co. A, Ledford's Regiment, October 1864 to May 1865; all service in Union County, Georgia. His officers surrendered at Kingston, Tn.

CHAPTER 1

EPHRAIM JACKSON

Ephraim Jackson was born in England at Eccleston, Lancashire about 1658. He came to America in 1687, being then about 27 years of age. In 1695 he married Rachel Newlin, daughter of Nicholas and Elizabeth Newlin who came from Montmellick Monthly Meeting, Ireland, in 1683 to Concord. She was born about 1674. After her marriage, her parents moved to Edgemont. Their transfer of membership from Montmellick, dated 2 MO 25th 1683, was signed by a committee which included the great Irish Quaker, William Edmunson. Ephraim Jackson, on arrival, had landed at Newcastle, Delaware, but after their marriage they were members of Chester Monthly Meeting in Pennsylvania. Ephraim died 11-1-1733 and Rachel in 1742. “Ephraim Jackson - Our first ancestor to come to this country was Ephraim Jackson, who emigrated from England. The author has made an extensive search of available records and has concluded from circumstantial evidence and other related factors that our first ancestor was the Ephraim Jackson who first settled in Bucks County, PA., appearing in the Pennsylvania Magazine, p. 231 of volume 9, under the title "A Partial List of Families who Resided in Bucks County, Pennsylvania, prior to 1687, with their date of arrival." The following is quoted from this article. "Jacob Hall of Macclesfield, Cheshire, England, shoemaker and Mary, his wife, arrived in Maryland the 3d of the 1th mo. 1684, in the 'Friendship,' of Liverpool, the Mr. Edmund Croston, and afterwards transported to this river, where his family arrived 28th 3d Mo. 1685. Children, Jacob, born the 8th 1th Mo. 1679, Sarah and Joseph. Servant, Ephraim Jackson, to serve 4 years, and to have meat, drink, washing & lodging, and L6 per annum."

It is certain that Ephraim Jackson returned to Cheshire, England, in 1709 on an extended trip for a visit and did not return until the early part of 1710. Upon his return he produced a certificate of attendance from Newton Monthly Meeting, Cheshire, England, which is recorded in the Providence Monthly Meeting, Chester County, PA., and reads as follows: **"Ephraim Jackson being returned from Great Britain and Produced a Certificate**

from Newton Monthly Meeting in Cheshire to the satisfaction of this meeting."

The Falls Monthly Meeting, Bucks County, PA., dated 5-3-1695 minutes contain the following: "Upon request of Ephraim Jackson by Joshua Hoopes and Joseph Kirkbride to have a certificate of his conversation whilst amongst us and of his clearness in relation of marriage, Wherefore it is agreed that Richard Hough and John Palmer do make inquiry concerning the same and account to the next meeting." . . . Ephraim Jackson and Rachel Newlin were married at the Concord Monthly Meeting, 12-10-1695, the marriage ceremony being performed at the meeting held on the same date, immediately following the second reading of their intention of marriage. Rachel Newlin was born at Mountmellick, Ireland, daughter of Nicholas and Elizabeth Newlin, a prominent family who came here from Ireland. . . .

Ephraim purchased 120 acres of land from Phillip Yarnall, which is recorded in Chester County Deed Book, p. 397, the deed bearing the date of the Eight Day of the seventh month, 1696. In 1703 he purchased 228 acres of land in Middletown Township, Chester County, PA., which is recorded at Harrisburg, PA., Ref - A2, p.520, patent by William Penn. (Note: This land is now in Delaware County, PA.,)

Chester Quarterly Meeting Minutes of 1712 6mo 4 The committee appointed by the last Q.M., to inspect the Minutes, report they have done so and found few mistakes and have procured Ephraim Jackson to inscribe them into the new book, the Meeting him four pounds for his labour." This has been described to be beautifully and delicately written. Ephraim was well known for his excellent penmanship and many deeds, wills, marriages and legal documents written by him are still in existence. Ephraim Jackson had received a better education than usual for a person of his day. He held the position of Clerk of Chester Monthly Meeting of Friends, of which he was an exemplary member. He was employed in civil affairs, especially where good penmanship was needed and was a successful farmer and a man of sound business ability. In 1710 he represented Chester County in the Provincial Assembly. He was conscientiously opposed to selling rum to Indians and took a firm stand against this practice, and was one of the active civic minded citizens who petitioned for a road to be built from Chester to Philadelphia. He was highly esteemed for his integrity, intelligence and accuracy of judgment. . . . He reared **seven** (?) children to whom he gave advantages of education superior to those usually accorded in his day, and in all family affairs he was a pattern of a Christian gentleman.
