To Comfort the Bereaved

The family of the deceased urgently needs the assurance that friends care. A funeral service is one way to meet this need, one way for us to say, "I want to be with you. I want to share your grief and to ease the pain. I want to offer my love and to pledge my continuing concern."

In addition to attending the funeral service, we may send flowers, write a warm personal letter of condolence or perhaps take in some food. All these acts say that we care, and they do make bereavement a little more bearable.

In a Christian funeral service comfort is conveyed through the Scripture and prayers. God says, "Your loved one has a dwelling place with Me. Moreover, my Spirit is constantly with you-so have no fear about the one who has passed on nor about your own ability to cope with the future."

To Worship Together When we worship together we are reminded with gratitude that although we do not know what the future holds, we do know Who holds the future.
