A local businessman, he was born in Good Hope on June 19, 1922 to the late Woodie Waters Bramblett and the late James Tandy Bramblett. After his early schooling, he went to work for the United States Government with the CCC Camp. He then joined the United States Army and was a World War II veteran, serving in campaigns in Europe and defending the

Panama Canal area. His military honors include five medals and two battle stars. After participating in active military duty, he served in the United States Army Reserves. He was a member of the American Legion for more than 50 years. He was the proprietor of Bramblett and Garrett Auto Service which he owned, operated and managed for more than 50 years.

Funeral services were held Jan. 9, 2003 at the Chapel of Meadows Funeral Home with the Rev. Wilson Donehoo officiating. The eulogy was by Mr. Bramblett's nephew, Rogal Doggett.

Interment was in East View Cemetery.
