Mr. Bullock was very involved in his community and was a member of the Chamber of Commerce, the Lion's Club as well as the Kiwanis Club, where he served as president of the Laurel club. Mr. Bullock and his family were long time members of the First Baptist Church of Laurel, where he was chairman of the deacons for many years. Mr. Bullock also preached at local churches in the community in his role as an ordained lay pastor. He was also active as a volunteer with the Salvation Army and the March of Dimes. After he retired as an attorney, he taught paralegal studies at Jones County Community College for a number of years. For more than 30 years, he was an avid jogger and was considered by many as one of the "founding members" of the Early Morning Jogging Club.

Mr. Bullock and his wite Feiton celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary in 1999; they were very much in love, reared four children and two grandchildren. Mr. Bullock was a loving father and husband and will be greatly missed by all who knew him. He is survived by children Linda C. Blair, Greg Bullock and Kenny Bullock, and grandchildren, Raney Cronin and Kendall Bullock.
