Stevenson would be the luxurious yacht Casco built in San Francisco in 1878 at a cost of \$40,000. She became famous after being chartered to Stevenson who wrote about her in his South Seas stories. In 1892 the Victoria Sealing Company acquired the Casco for \$7,000. In sealing service, luxury items would not be needed so items like velvet cushions were, no doubt, removed. In the period 1906 to 1908 Reginald Genn served as secretary of The Victoria Sealing Company, Limited so he was in a position to acquire a souvenir from the boat. The Casco was wrecked during a trip to Siberia in 1919.</b>
