He was, therefore, in active service at the age of 12. His rank is listed as “Bugler”. The way he explained it to me, before the days of field radios the only way for the officers to communicate with the troops was by way of a bugler. Big responsibility for a 12 year old. Imagine what would have happened if he was told to blow “retreat” and he blew “charge”, by mistake.
