<b>OB - 01</b>	<p><b>Fruit knives. Blades are Sheffield stainless steel. Handles are French ivory, a celluloid product developed to simulate ivory, first produced in 1866.</b></p> <p><b>“Aunt” Ollie (Olive Brown) was not a relative, but a friend of Francis Rivers, dating to the WW I period of history. It is likely that Ollie was an employee at the Carleton Cafe, Broad and View St., Victoria, which was owned by Francis Rivers. When I knew her, her husband was Horace Beers.</b></p> <p><b>Also from that time, another friend was “Uncle” Charlie (Charles Brown) who was a logger from Cowichan Lake. I don’t know if Ollie and Charlie were related. John recalls Horace and Ollie having a place at Shawnigan Lake</b></p>
