Jolly, Norman W (based on L T Carron (2000) "A brief history of the Australian Forestry School")

Born and educated in South Australia, including at Adelaide University. Was that State's first Rhodes Scholar in 1904. Studied for BA and Diploma of Forestry at Oxford University. Returned to Australia in 1909. Spent most of his career at senior levels in South Australia, Queensland and New South Wales forest services. In 1925, appointed first head of the Australian Forestry School, in Adelaide University. Ran the school single-handedly in 1926, in Adelaide. When the school transferred to Canberra, he returned to professional practice. His name is commemorated by the N W Jolly Medal, the Institute of Foresters of Australia's highest award for merit.
