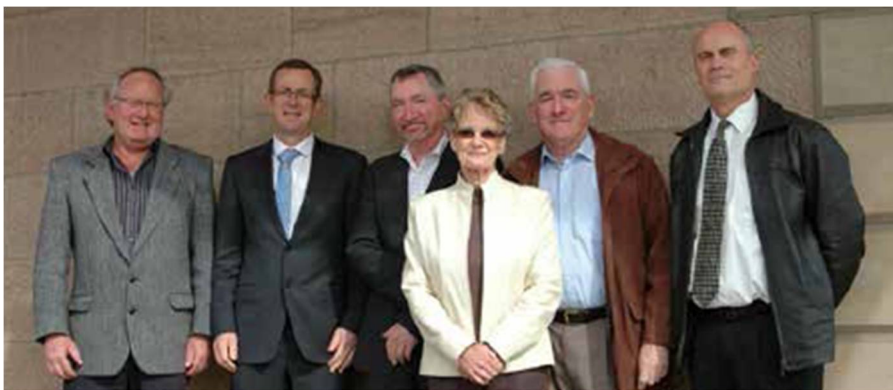

It is with great sorrow that I am the bearer of sad news with the passing of our good friend and colleague Ian Whyte on the 16th of November 2017, after a long illness due to prostate cancer. A private funeral will be held on the 22nd of November in Melbourne.

Ian Whyte worked as a forester with Department of Forests before independence. He developed the forestry landowner scheme for the Gogol timber area in Madang besides being involved in numerous forest inventory surveys including assessment of the Bulolo plantations and lectured at the Forestry College. After PNG he joined APPM and then was CEO of the Tasmania Forest Industries Association etc
