Family Stories

Thank you to Mrs Amanda Waller for sending in the following information about her great-great-grandmother, Esther Margaret Middleton (a descendant of Ann Grono and James Smallwood).

Esther Margaret MIDDLETON

My great-great-grandmother, Esther Margaret Middleton was the great-granddaughter of John Grono.

Esther was born on the 30th September 1852 in Pitt Town the youngest daughter of Elizabeth Smallwood and Peter Middleton. Elizabeth was the daughter of James Smallwood and Ann Grono (daughter of John and Elizabeth Grono). Esther was known to her family as Ettie. I have discovered through my research that Ettie had a rather sad life. She was born five months after the death of her father, Peter, who died in a tragic accident at Mudgee. Ettie’s mother Elizabeth was left with three small children to look after and a baby on the way. Elizabeth remarried and had six more children to her second husband Phillip Williams.

Little is known of Ettie’s early years. She next appears in Terrari NSW, in the Narrabri area at the age of twenty three and has a relationship with Ruben Gunter giving birth to a daughter Margaret Esther in 1875. Unfortunately Margaret Esther lived for only ten weeks dying of measles. It appears the relationship with Ruben Gunter does not survive either.

Ettie married Andrew Barber on the 14th February 1876, at the age of twenty four, at Narrabri. Ettie and Andrew had four children, Mary Ann (my great-grandmother) born on the 25th March 1877 at Boolcarol Station, Wee Waa; Frederick John born 1879 at Narrabri; Emma May born 1881 at Narrabri; and Florence Elizabeth born 1884 Pitt Town.

Family knowledge passed on from Mary Ann to her daughter Ada Brown was that Andrew and Ettie returned to Pitt Town with the three eldest children. Ettie gave birth to her youngest child Florence after arriving in Pitt Town. Andrew left Ettie and the children at Pitt Town and the family did not hear from him again. I have been unsuccessful in my efforts to trace Andrew after he left Pitt Town.

Esther passed away in Pitt Town on the 1st September 1884 at the age of thirty two and is buried in the Anglican Cemetery Pitt Town. Baby Florence passed away on the 4th March 1885, six months after her mother, she too is buried at the Anglican Cemetery Pitt Town, both graves are unmarked. Ettie's and Florence's deaths were reported by Ettie's brother-in-law Henry Williams.

The children, Mary Ann, Frederick and Emma were fostered by relatives in Pitt Town.

It would appear Ettie's eldest daughter Mary Ann was traumatised by the death of her mother and sister and the loss of her father at such a young age. She married William Arthur Clark at his residence at Maraylya in 1899. Mary Ann obviously didn't plan to go anywhere once she had a home of her own as she spent the next sixty two years of her life at the property, giving birth to ten children there, only leaving when she was required to vote. She too was blessed with the Grono gene for longevity dying at the age of 84 years.





A Colonial Churchyard compiled by Ebenezer Church Cemetery Trust




This publication was released in 2006. It provides complete transcriptions of all headstones/vaults and maps of grave locations for the cemetery within the Ebenezer Church grounds.
