

Pneumonia Proves Fatal to Mrs. Floyd Butler of Fort Wayne

Mrs. Floyd Butler, formerly Miss Mary Ann Teeple, better known as "Goldie" Teeple, of this city, died last evening at 6:20 o'clock at her home in Fort Wayne following an illness since a week ago Friday of pneumonia. Had she lived until next January 25, she would have been twenty-seven years of age.

Mrs. Butler was born in this city January 25, 1892, being a daughter of D.F. Teeple, to whose home on First street the body was brought this afternoon by the Yager Bros. & Reinling ambulance, until the funeral Wednesday morning at 9 o'clock at the St. Marys Catholic Church.

Her relatives are the father, the step-mother, a sister Mrs. Agnes Hardy, of Elkhart; and the following half-brothers and sisters: Mrs. Louise Braden, Lansing, Mich.; David H., Naomi, Marcella, Lorena, Leo, Patricia, Mildred, Anthony Edward and Edward Anthony.

All of her girlhood years were spent here, where she has many friends, and in fact, it was only since her marriage a few years ago, that she moved to Fort Wayne. Her hosts of friends here will be sorry to hear of her death.
