### Mrs. Olive Butler Dies Unexpectedly

Mrs. Olive Josephine Butler, 84, a retired Decatur business-woman, died suddenly at 5:40 pm. Tuesday at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Francis Eady, 1002 Winchester street. She had been in failing health for three years but death was unexpected.

Mrs. Butler was co-owner, with Leftie Lang, of the L & O Dress Shop in Decatur from 1942 until 1962. She was formerly employed at the Boston Store.

A lifelong resident of Decatur, she was born here May 4, 1884, a daughter of William and Emma Wand-McBarnes, and was married to Franklin Butler March 4, 1902. Her husband preceded her in death in 1940.

Mrs. Butler was a member of St. Mark's United Methodist church and the Royal Neighbors.

Surviving are the daughter, Mrs. Francis (Melvena) Eady of Decatur; one granddaughter, Mrs. Charles (Jane) Whitted of Merrillville, and two great-grandchildren, Polly and Charles Whitted, Jr.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p.m. Friday at the Zwick funeral home, with Rev. Fuhrman Miller officiating. Burial will be in the Decatur cemetery. Friends may call at the funeral home after 7 p.m. today until time of the services.
