It was finalls recided that the one chance of saving his litu lay in amputating the leg, thus preventing the spreading ot the disease. Accorilingly the time for operation was set for this morning and took place at the home of his mother, Mirs. Mary Elzey, of South Eighth strect Ithe young man displased great forlitude and did everything to assist in preparing for the ordeal. When the amputation was nearlv completel the suffered a sinking spell and his denth occurred soon after.

While the operation, from-en surgical standpoint was a suceess, h1s weakened condition was unable to withstand the shock.

The deceased was bern September 31, 1886. and would have been twentytwo vears of age. on the thirty-first or this month. He was the son of Quil and Mary blzey: prominent residents of this cointy. The father d!ed many years ago, and smbe his death the mother had made her home with her two sons, in this cuy. A brother, Forest Elzes, residing at home, and two sisters-Mrs. Katie thlman. liting in Illinois, and Mrs. Carrie Shaciley, of Berme-survive.

The deceased was a hoy of excellent cualities and had a host of frtends. Last friday he publiety professed his Christian faith, receiving the ordinance of christiun baptism. The plans for the funeral services are not yet arranged.
