Heart Attack is Fatal to Mrs. John Everett Wednesday Night

Mrs. Jane Everett, 77, prominent Decatur woman, died at the Everett home of Adams street, at 7:45 o'clock Wednesday night. Mrs. Everett had been ill since Monday with indigestion, but her condition was not regarded as serious. A heart attack was the cause of the death.

Mrs. Everett was the last living charter member of the First Baptist church of Decatur and had been active in the church societies and business affairs ever since the founding. She served as a member of the Adams county board of charities until last Christmas day at which time she resigned from the board.

Mrs. Everett was born in Van Wert county, Ohio, December 12, 1854, a daughter of Amos and Rachel Roop. On March 12, 1876, she was united in marriage to John Everett, who survives. Mr. and Mrs. Everett had been married 56 years, most of which time was spent in Decatur.

She was a faithful member of the Baptist church, and since its founding had missed attending Sunday services, only when away from the city or when ill. Surviving besides the husband, is a daughter, Mrs. Cal E. Peterson of this city. A son Carl Everett died at the age of eight years. No brothers or sisters survive.

Funeral services will be held Saturday morning at 9:30 o'clock at the home on Adams street and at 10 o'clock at the First Baptist church. Burial will be made at Decatur cemetery. Rev. A. B. Brown will have charge of the services.
