Three Local Soldiers Are Dead, Two Missing

Lt. Robert J. Maxwell Dies of Wounds; Bomber Crash Takes New Haven Boy's Life; Pfc. Carl Jackson Killed in France

Cpl. Howard Clark, 19-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Lewis Clark of New Haven, Second Lt. Robert J. Maxwell, 30, son of Mr. & Mrs. Charles Maxwell of 912 Barr street; Pfc. Carl F. Jackson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry E. Jackson of 122 East Branning avenue, and T/5 Lewis C. Locchner, 24, son of Mr. and Mrs. L. C. Locchner, 1410 Wells street, have lost their lives in the service of their county, reports from the war department disclosed today.

Missing in action are Pfc. Donald D. LaPointe, 21, son of Mr. and Mrs. William A. LaPointe, 205 Lexington court, and S/Sgt. Patrick J. DeRose, 20, son of Mr. and Mrs. Pasquale DeRose, 301 Brandriff street. <snip>

Killed in action in France on July 27, Pfc. Jackson went into France on D-day with the infantry. He was graduated from South Side high school and later worked on his parents' farm near Decatur. Surviving are the parents and two sisters, Beulah and Erma Jackson. <snip>

Memorial Rites Set for Pfc. C. F. Jackson

Memorial services for Pfc. Carl F. Jackson, son of Mr and Mrs. Harry E. Jackson of 122 East Branning street, killed in action in France on July 27, will be held at 2:30 p.m. Sunday in the First Evangelical church, South Clinton and DeWald streets. Dr. George J. Long, pastor, will be in charge of the service and will be assisted by Rev. Francis H. Willard, pastor of the Evangelical church at Decatur.

An honor guard from Camp Scott will be present. Music for the service will be presented by members of the Calvary Evangelical church of Decatur where Pfc. Jackson's name is inscribed on the honor roll.
