DECATUR MAN KILLED AND TWO ARE HURT

DECATUR, Jan. 15 - Frank Liniger, 53, former Adams county commissioner, was killed instantly at 5:30 p.m. Wednesday when the car he was driving crashed into the rear of a parked truck on U. S. highway 224, one and one-half miles west of here, and his wife and a daughter were seriously injured.

Mr. Liniger was enroute to his home three miles west of Decatur with his wife, Mabel, and a daughter, Chloe, when the crash occurred.

Philip Perry, 20, of Rockhall, Md., driver of the truck, told Sheriff Herman Bowman that he had stopped to study a road map and was just preparing to start again when the accident occurred.

Liniger died of a crushed chest. His wife and daughter are in the Adams County hospital. Mrs. Liniger had both legs broken, and the daughter has a fractured leg and a dislocated hip.

Surviving besides the wife and daughter are a son, Vaun, with the Air Corps in Texas and another daughter.
