Victim Of Light Plant Accident To Be Buried Saturday

Funeral services for Frank Lough, 56. of this city, who was killed Wednesday morning when he was pulled into a conveyor at the municipal light plant, will be held Saturday.

The services will be held Saturday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock at the Lough home, corner of Russell and McBarnes street, and 2 o'clock at the First U. B. Church. Rev. G. T. Rosselot will officiate and burial will be in the Decatur Cemetery.

The body will be taken to the residence from the Black Funeral Home this evening and may be viewed there until time for the services.

Meanwhile, Coroner J. Jerome Yager of Berne is continuing his investigation of the fatality. He indicated today that he would return a verdict of accidental death. Arthur A. A'Neal, erecting engineer of the Columbus Conveyor Company, Columbus, Ohio, the victim's foreman on the job, told Coroner Yager that his trouser leg must have accidently struck the switch which set the coal conveyer in motion and pulled Lough in. He attempted to free the victim but was unsuccessful. A'Neal was badley shaken by the incident and had not
