

**Charles Magley Dies This Morning  
Former County Road Supervisor Is Dead**

Charles E. Magley, 72, former superintendent of the Adams county highway department, died at 3 o'clock this morning at his home three miles north of Decatur. Death was attributed to uremic poisoning. He had been in failing health since December.

A lifelong resident of Root township, he was born March 25, 1873, the son of Henry and Louisa Kart-Magley. He was married to Mary O. Cline June 8 1898. Mrs. Magley preceded her husband in death.

Mr. Magley was active in Democratic politics for many years. He served as trustee of Root township for six years and was also a township assessor. He was superintendent of the county highway department from 1920 to 1928, and was employed by the state highway department for two years, following which he retired to his farm. At one time he operated the magley tile mill near Monmouth.

He was a member of the Alpha Methodist church near Monmouth.

Surviving are a sister, Mrs. C. D. Lewton of Decatur and a brother, John C. Magley of Root township. Wayne and Esther Burger have made their home with Mr. Magley for many years.

Funeral services will be held at 2:30 o'clock Wednesday afternoon at the Zwick funeral home, with the Rev. G. A. Eddy officiating. Burial will be in the Decatur cemetery. Friends may call at the funeral home after 7:30 o'clock this evening.
