Martin V. Miller Is Taken By Death

Funeral Services To Be Wednesday

Martin V. Miller, 76, died suddenly at 9 o'clock Sunday morning at his home, 116 South Fifth street. He had been ill since last August, but his death was unexpected.

He was employed in the Carnegie, Illinois steel works in Gary, IN. He then lived in Michigan until 1950, when he moved to Decatur.

He was born in Adams county Oct. 3, 1876, a son of Jesse S. and Sarah Jane Gause-Miller. He was first married in 1903 to Hattie Maurer, of Berne, who died in 1904. He was married to Lucy A. Brown Aug. 7, 1907.

Mr. Miller was a veteran of the Spanish-American war, enlisting in the U. S. army Sept. 22, 1899 and serving until his discharge Sept. 12, 1900. He was stationed at Luzon in the Philippines.

He was a member of the First Methodist church.

Surviving in addition to wife are six sons, Ralph of Geneva, Harold of Gary, Oliver of Gary, Martin of Fort Wayne, Wilbur of Ypsilanti, Mich. and Robert of Pontiac, Mich.; two daughters, Mrs. Florence Tulloch of Gary and Mrs. Fern Freeland of Arlington, Tex.; 11 grandchildren; and one brother, Andrew Miller of Fort Wayne. Three sisters and three brothers are deceased.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p.m. Wednesday at the Zwick funeral home, the Rev. Samuel Emerick officiating. Burial will be in the Decatur cemetery with Adams Post 43, American Legion conducting military rites. Friends may call at the funeral home after 7:30 o'clock this evening.
