DALE D. MOSES, 85, of route 3, well known Adams county resident and a former county commissioner, died at 4:30 a.m. this morning at the Decatur Community Care Center. He had been in failing health for the past two years.

Mr. MOSES served as a county commissioner from 1940 until 1948, and was one of the few Republicans ever elected to this post. He owned and operated Moses Dairy From 1930 to 1952.
