MRS. PARRISH DEAD

End Came During Last Evening

Was Well Known Lady and Had Been Sick for Two Years

Mrs. John Parrish died at her home in the west part of the city at 10:30 o'clock Sunday evening after an illness of two years, during most of which time she has suffered untold agonies. Her ailment was tuberculosis which originated in the abdomen and finally became general. She was a kind Christian lady, well known and beloved by many.

Mrs. Nettie Baker Parrish was born in this city, being the daughter of Charles H. and Sarah Baker. She was twenty-eight years, ten months and seventeen days old. She was a faithful member of the Methodist church and also a sister in the order of Rathbone Sisters.

During her long illness she has been patient and happy, enduring the terrible pains with a fortitude that comes only to those who believe in life eternal. About a year ago an operation was performed by physicians at Fort Wayne with the hope that she might be permitted to live but her condition was found to be such that there could be no hope. Since then the end has been but a matter of time and her bravery was shown each day as she appeared the most happy of the household.

Her husband is a teacher in the public schools and it probable that the schools, the south ward at least, will be dismissed a half day.

The funeral services will be held Wednesday morning at ten o'clock at the Methodist church, Rev. Hudson and Rev. Pontius officiating. The remains may be viewed from ten to four Tuesday afternoon and from seven to eight the same evening.
