

**Clyde M. Rice Killed by Train at Lorraine, O**  
**Former teacher and Mail Carrier in Decatur Meets Death Thursday**  
**Parents Reside at Monmouth**

Clyde M. Rice, age 42, of South Bend, former school teacher and mail carrier of this city, was killed at Lorraine, Ohio, about noon Thursday when a passenger train struck the automobile in which he was riding. Details of the accident had not been received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. David M. Rice, of Monmouth, up to noon today. The undertaker at Lorraine notified a local undertaker that the accident happened about ??? today. Word of the death was not received here until about 9:30 o'clock last night.

The body will be returned to this city sometime today and taken to the Black undertaking parlors and then removed to the home of Mr. Rice's parents, from which place the funeral services will be held. The sus... is that Mr. Rice, who worked at Youngstown, Ohio, with an insurance company, was on his way to South Bend when the accident happened. The Lorraine undertaker said that Mr. Rice had driven his care directly in front of the train.

The deceased was born in Root township, Adams county, September 6, 1884. He attended the local schools in this county and also took a second course at the Marion Normal school. He taught school at the North Ward building in this city and later accepted a position with the Decatur post office as city mail carrier. He also served as a rural carrier. In June 1907, he was married to Miss May Warner.

About 12 years ago, the family moved to Fort Wayne, where they lived about two years. They moved to South Bend and Mr. Rice was employed by the Studebaker corporation. About a year ago, they moved to Youngstown, Ohio, but later moved back to South Ben. He was a representative for the Equitable Life Insurance company of Des Moines, Ia.

Besides his parents, who live at Monmouth, Mr. Rice is survived by his wife and three children, Dorothy, age 17; Esther, age 15, and David Warner, age 9. One child, Marjorie Ruth, met an untimely death by drowning in a cistern shortly after the family moved to Fort Wayne.

Five brothers and sisters also survive, namely, David Otto Rice, Sioux City, Iowa; Mrs. Edith M. Crawford, Los Angeles, Calif.; Miss Florence Rice, R. W. and Robert J. Rice, at home. Two sisters and one brother are dead. Benjamin Rice, a brother was electrocuted about 11 years ago when he touched a high tension wire while working on the interurban line. The deceased was a member of the Methodist church and the Knights of Pythias and Masonic lodges.

Funeral arrangements had not been completed up to noon today, pending...
