LEAVES ESTATE TO CHURCH WORK

DECATUR, Ind. Nov 19 - The will of John Woy, who was found dead from asphyxiation, was probated today, as he has no direct heirs and it was thought best to do that any arrangements he may have made in the will might be carried out at once. The bulk of his estate was left to the Evangelical Lutheran church of the general synod - to be divided into four parts - to the boards of church extension, foreign missions, home missions, and Pastor's Fund society. This is to be made after the following bequests and conditions have been complied with. His personal and real estate and promissory notes are to be sold or collected, \$200 paid to Cora Bonbrake, \$300 to Mrs. Sarah Fansler for her care for him in his illness, and the body of his wife and child be removed from the Monmouth cemetery to his lot in the Decatur cemetery, his body to be interred there also and the inscription cut on the tomb-stone erected there. C. D. Kunkel is named executor. The will was written in July of 1903 and witnessed by R. R. Peterson and Cal Peterson.
