While serving as a Staff Sargent, he was earned and received a Purple Heart, a European/ African/ Middle Eastern service medal, a good conduct medal, a bronze star medal, an American Theater medal, and a WWII victory medal in the Battle of the Bulge. He served in Company M, 319th Infantry 80th Division. He moved to Adams County, IN and married Elizabeth (Betty) Roudebush on October 21, 1949. Six children, Rex, Sandy, Kathy, Connie, Jim, and Lisa, were born to them while living within Adams County, all of which remained in the area. Franklin was selfemployed as a truck driver and a farmer. He became a member of the Pleasant Dale Church of the Brethren. On Thursday, September 30, 2010, Franklin passed away at the Adams Memorial Hospital in Decatur, IN at 89 years of age.
