Walter was born on February 13, 1897 in Monroe, Indiana. He was born to Thomas Benton Oliver and Mary Aldeena (Hocker) Oliver. Walter was the fifth child of the eleven children that Thomas and Mary had. He served in the U.S. Army during World War I. He was almost sent to battle but came down with a bad case of pneumonia. Once he got back from the Army, Walter was a farmer most of his life. For farming he mostly used livestock, which would be common in those times. He also worked as a carpenter.
