

Glenn Workinger

Glenn Workinger was born April 7, 1891 in Bluecreek Township, Adams County, Indiana. His parents were Charles Clayton Scofield Workinger and Amanda Elizabeth (Meyers) Workinger. Glenn had nine siblings: Harry, Mable, Charles, Birgo, Eva, David, Thresa, Loy, and Everil. Glenn's father was a farm hand, and his mother was a housewife. They lived in Adams County. Glenn Workinger married Mary Wechter on October 5, 1912 in Adams County, Indiana. They had four children: Flo, Fern, Dale, and Charles. Glenn was a hard worker. He had many different jobs throughout his life, but that was common in that time frame. His son Charles said, "It seemed like every job he worked was a plus. It bettered him with every job." Glenn and his family also moved a lot, because of his jobs. They had lived in Detroit, Michigan for a few years, Ohio for a few years, and then back to Adams County where they stayed till he died. While he was living in Adams Co. he was a member of the first school board at Adams Central School. He served for four years as the secretary. Glenn Workinger died of a heart attack on November 7, 1981 in Decatur, Indiana. He was buried in the Ray Cemetery in Monroe, Adams County, Indiana.
